GOD'S GREATEST MOVE IN THESE TIMES - PASTOR PAUL SILWAY

1. Many people are worried about the last days and spend their time talking about the end of the world. But the Bible says we have been in the “last days” since the time of Pentecost (Acts 2:17). That means the last days began long ago. So, instead of packing our bags and waiting to escape, we must do what Jesus told us—“Occupy till I come” (Luke 19:13). That means we must be active, not passive. We must live for God and fulfill His purpose.

2. This is not the time to fear or hide. This is the time to shine. God is raising up sons and daughters who love Him and choose to live for Him. These are people who surrender to God, walk in love, speak truth, and are filled with the Spirit. They don't live for themselves. They live to show God's love and power to others.

3. These people will know the times and seasons we are living in. Just like the sons of Issachar in the Bible who understood the times and knew what to do (1 Chronicles 12:32), God's people today will understand what He is doing. They won't be confused or afraid. They will hear God clearly and help others make the right choices.

4. When these sons and daughters speak, things will change—not just in the natural world, but in the spirit world too. Their words will carry power because they speak with God's authority. Impossible things will begin to shift and move, because Heaven will back them.

5. They won't waste their time arguing with people who speak fear or confusion. Some are saying the end is near, or the Rapture is happening soon. Others say disaster is coming. These voices create fear, not faith. God's people should not be shaken by these voices. Instead, they should stay focused on what God is saying now.

6. There are many who have predicted the Rapture would happen in certain years—some said 2020, some said 2023, others say 2030. But those predictions were wrong. The truth is the Rapture is not happening anytime soon. God has shown that there is still time left. There are still things to be done, lives to be saved, and nations to be reached.

7. Even if some of what these people say matches the Bible, they are missing the right time and season. When they speak too soon or wrongly, it causes confusion in the Body of Christ. People lose hope, get discouraged, and stop doing what God has called them to do. This gives the enemy a chance to laugh and distract us from our real mission.

8. God wants to fill Heaven with people. More than two-thirds of the world has not yet heard the true Gospel. That means God still has a big plan! He is not in a hurry to end things. He wants His people to rise up, preach the Gospel, and help bring many into His Kingdom. That is the heart of God.

9. So don't focus on fear. Focus on God's plan. These are not the days of hiding and waiting for the end. These are the days of harvest. These are the days when Heaven will move powerfully on Earth. God's greatest move is not behind us—it is ahead of us. Let's be a part of it.

10. Remember what Jesus said in Matthew 24:14 – "This gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all nations, and then the end will come." That means the end will not come until the message of Jesus reaches every nation. That time has not yet come. So let's preach, love, pray, and serve with all our hearts.

11. Let's not be distracted by wrong voices or fearful messages. Let's listen to the Holy Spirit and follow His leading. This is a season to walk in the light, with boldness and joy. God is doing a new thing on the Earth. Be ready, be available, and be full of faith.

12. Don't just talk about the end—live for God every day. Serve others. Love deeply. Speak life. Shine His light in dark places. The greatest days for the Body of Christ are not over. They are just beginning.

13. Jesus said in Luke 10:2 – “The harvest is great, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray... that He would send out workers into His harvest.” God is calling workers now. Will you be one of them?

14. The time is now. Heaven is watching. The earth is waiting. Don’t be afraid. Be filled with the Spirit. Know the times. Know the season. And step into your destiny with faith, love, and boldness. The best is yet to come!

YOU ARE FREE FROM EVERY CURSE — A MESSAGE OF VICTORY AND FREEDOM — Pastor Paul Silway

1. Curses are not just ideas or imaginations. They are real spiritual forces that operate in the unseen world. They entered because of sin and are still working in the world wherever sin exists. Curses bring destruction, delay, confusion, and loss. But the good news is that you don’t have to live under any curse anymore.

2. When Jesus Christ went to the cross, He paid the full price for everything—sin, sickness, disease, fear, and separation from God. He broke the power of the curse completely. Anyone who accepts Jesus as their Lord and Savior is free from every curse because the root cause—sin—has been dealt with by His sacrifice.

3. The Bible says in Galatians 3:13 that Jesus has redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us. That means He took our place. He removed the curse so we can live in the blessing. But this blessing only becomes active when we believe it and live by faith in Christ.

4. Some people, even believers, still suffer because they don’t know the truth or are controlled by fear or doubt. When someone allows fear, doubt, or spiritual ignorance to grow, the forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—can try to take advantage. But they have no right or power unless someone gives them access through unbelief or disobedience.

5. Some traditions and wrong teachings also open the door to curses. But as children of God, we are not called to carry curses. We are called to inherit blessings. 1 Peter 3:9 clearly says we are called to receive a blessing, not trouble. A curse is the opposite of a blessing. A blessing releases God’s favor, while a curse releases confusion and destruction.

6. Sometimes, when praying for people, one may see a dark shadow over their life. This is a spiritual picture of a curse working. But we don’t have to fear that, because Jesus already defeated it. We simply stand on His Word and walk in the light of His truth.

7. The moment you received Jesus, you also received the blessings of Abraham. That means your spiritual DNA has been changed. You are now programmed for life, growth, success, and increase—not loss or failure. You are a new creation, and curses no longer have a legal right over your life.

8. Your life now belongs to God’s Kingdom, where only blessings flow. The Bible says in Numbers 23:23 that no curse can stand against God’s people. If that was true under the old covenant, how much more powerful is our position now under the new covenant through Jesus Christ!

9. Even when someone tries to speak against you or block your prosperity, don’t be afraid. Their words have no power. You don’t need to fight or fear—you only need to believe and speak God’s Word. Isaiah 54:17 says no weapon formed against you will succeed, and that is your promise.

10. Your life is hidden in Christ. You are seated with Him in heavenly places. You are sealed with the Holy Spirit and surrounded by the promises of God. You walk in divine protection, and the mark of God is upon your life. The forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—know this and cannot touch what belongs to God.

11. You must never accept fear, sickness, failure, or confusion as normal. These are part of the curse, and you have been redeemed from them. Remind yourself daily that you are free. Don't say, "Maybe I'm cursed," when things go wrong. Say what God says about you: "I am blessed and not cursed."

12. Because of what Jesus has done, no power can hold you back. No curse has the right to stay in your life. You are covered by the blood of Jesus, and every promise of God is yes and amen in your life. Walk boldly, live in peace, and always remember—you are completely free from every curse.

LIFE IS SHORT — INVEST FOR ETERNITY, NOT HELL By Pastor Paul Silway

(A Simple, Eye-Opening Truth About Life, Death, and Eternal Consequences)

1. Anyone who murders another human being—whether directly or indirectly—or supports, encourages, or hides such acts behind power or religion, cannot enter Heaven.

2. According to the truth of God's Word, a murderer is destined for Hell.

3. Everything in this world is temporary. Nothing we own or see will last forever.

4. We have seen the strongest, wisest, and most powerful people eventually die. No one has ever lived forever on Earth.

5. One day, God will call back the breath of life that He gave to each person. When that happens, the body falls into dust and never returns to live in this world again.

6. No one comes back to claim their body, their wealth, their land, their family, or their nation. There is no such thing as reincarnation.

7. In this short life, let us learn to respect every human being, because each person was created in the image and goodness of God.

8. But mankind has moved away from God. Now, many reflect the image of Satan, who is a thief, a liar, a killer, and a destroyer.

9. Just look at today's world—women are being raped and killed. Children too are suffering such terrible evil.

10. People get violent and angry even for small reasons. Many are ready to kill over little things.

11. Religion, which should teach love, is now being used to spread hate and violence.

12. People have mixed up the message of God's love with Satan's message of hatred and destruction.

13. Because of this, God is being misrepresented.

14. People have confused God's holy nature with Satan's evil nature. And now, in the minds of many, God appears as the source of evil.

15. When people think God is evil, they naturally begin to follow that evil image and copy it in their own lives.

16. If it were true that murderers, haters, and violent people could go to Heaven, then what hope is there for the good and kind? Why would a good person want to spend eternity with murderers?

17. But the truth from the Bible is clear—all murderers, haters, and violent people will be sent to the torment of Hell forever.

18. The saddest part is this: no one comes back from Hell to tell us how terrible it is, so people falsely believe that it doesn't exist or that even the worst sinners can enter Heaven.

19. Whatever money, position, or property you have today, whether earned righteously or unrighteously, it is only for a short time. It cannot go with you into eternity.

20. Don't envy those with high positions or great power. Their success only lasts as long as their earthly life and physical body.

21. The moment they die, everything is taken away from them. They came empty, and they return empty.

22. Even the Earth that some worship as "Mother Earth" strips them of everything they once claimed as theirs. It sends them away with nothing. This is the final truth.

23. There were no past lives, no future lives, no wandering souls, and no reincarnation.

24. You only have this one life, and it will come to an end one day.

25. Death comes suddenly. It doesn't send an email or give a phone call. When it comes, it takes you instantly.

26. Death doesn't ask your permission. Once you die, you either go to Heaven or to Hell. There is no third place.

27. Once you leave your physical body and this world, you will never return to it. Others will enjoy what you left behind—your money, your land, and your belongings.

28. People might speak good things about you or say nothing at all. But you will never hear it, because your body is gone and you no longer have your earthly senses.

29. There are only two eternal destinations: Heaven or Hell.

30. If you miss Heaven, you cannot escape Hell. One or the other will be your final home.

31. The greatest fear is not death—it's what happens after death. The death angels that take people to Hell carry an atmosphere of fear with them.

32. These terrifying beings wait eagerly to drag unrepentant souls into eternal torment. This is not a story—it is the truth.

Think wisely. Life is short. Hell is real. But so is Heaven. Choose today where you want to spend forever.

"It is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment." – Hebrews 9:27

THE TRUTH ABOUT SIN, SINS, AND SALVATION - Pastor Paul Silway

1. Many people believe that doing good works will save them. But the Bible tells us something very different. You are not saved by your good works. That is religion — it focuses only on the outside. Religion may change how you look or act, but it does not change your heart. And your heart is the real you.
2. God never works from the outside in. He works from the inside out. What we truly need is a new heart — and that takes a miracle from God. Our real problem is not just what we do, but who we are inside. The Bible says in Jeremiah 17:9, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked."
3. We commit sinful acts because we have a sinful nature. This sinful nature is what the Bible calls "sin" — the power inside us that causes us to do wrong things. The things we do — lying, stealing, hating — are called "sins." But those acts come from the sinful nature already in us.
4. We are not sinners because we do sinful things. We do sinful things because we are already sinners. This means that sin is not just about our actions, but about our inner condition. In Romans 5:12, it says, "Through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned."
5. Every human being is born with this sinful nature. It was inherited from the first man, Adam. Because of his disobedience, sin entered into the human race. That's why we don't become sinners by choice — we are born sinners. And because of that nature, we naturally commit sins.
6. So what is the difference between "sin" and "sins"? Sin (singular) is the power or nature inside us that causes us to do wrong. Sins (plural) are the actual wrong things we do — the actions. The Bible in Romans 7:17 says, "It is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me." That sin inside is what leads to sins on the outside.
7. You may try to stop sinning by being religious or doing good works. You might help the poor, give to charity, or attend services. But these things cannot save you. If good works could save us, then people would boast in heaven about how much they gave or how many good things they did. But salvation is not something you can earn.
8. In Ephesians 2:8-9, it says, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." This means no one can brag in heaven about saving themselves. No one can say, "I got here because I did so many good things."

9. If we could save ourselves by good deeds, then Jesus wouldn't have needed to die for us. But He did. He suffered and gave His life because only His sacrifice could pay the price for our sin. Romans 6:23 says, "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

10. When you understand this truth, your heart is filled with gratitude. In heaven, no one will praise themselves. Everyone will praise Jesus — because only He is worthy. He gave His life so that we could be saved. In Revelation 5:12, it says, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom, and strength and honor and glory and blessing!"

11. Salvation is not about religion. It is about a relationship with Jesus. When you believe in Him, receive His life, and trust in His finished work, God makes you His child. John 1:12 says, "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God."

12. This is how you become part of God's family — not by your own efforts, but through faith in Jesus. Only Jesus can change your heart. Only Jesus can remove your sinful nature and give you a new life. And this new life is the beginning of a real, eternal relationship with God.

FORGIVE AND LIVE FREE

(The Healing Power Of Forgiveness)

1. Many people carry pain, bitterness, and anger in their hearts because of what others have done to them. But holding on to unforgiveness does more damage to us than to the person who hurt us. It becomes like a poison that eats away our peace, joy, and even health. God wants us to be free, and the key to that freedom is forgiveness.

2. Forgiveness is not just a good idea; it is a command from God. He wants us to forgive others because He has already forgiven us. When we forgive, we are choosing to obey God's Word, and that obedience opens the door to healing, peace, and blessings in our lives.

3. Many people think that forgiving means saying that what happened was okay. But that's not true. Forgiveness doesn't mean the wrong thing was right. It means we are choosing to let go of the pain and allow God to bring healing and justice in His way.

4. The Bible clearly teaches that if we don't forgive others, our own sins will not be forgiven. Jesus said, "If you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins." (Matthew 6:15) That shows how serious this is. Forgiveness is not optional—it is necessary.

5. When you forgive, you set yourself free. It's like unlocking a prison and walking out. That prison was built by anger, hurt, and offense. Forgiveness tears down the wall and allows the love and peace of God to flow freely in your life again.

6. When you hold onto bitterness, it blocks your prayers and even stops your faith from working. The Bible says faith works through love. If love is not flowing, faith cannot grow. Unforgiveness shuts down the power of God in your life, and that's why it's so important to forgive.

7. You may say, "But I don't feel like forgiving." That's okay—because forgiveness is not based on feelings. It is a choice. When you decide to forgive, even if it's hard, God will help your heart to catch up with your decision. His strength will carry you.

8. The real enemy, which is not people, but Satan and his demons, wants you to stay in unforgiveness. They know that if you keep that anger, they can steal your joy and stop your healing. But when you forgive, you take back your freedom, and you stop the plan of the real enemy.

9. Sometimes we think we are punishing the other person by not forgiving them. But we are only punishing ourselves. The Bible says that when we don't forgive, we are turned over to the torturers. (Matthew 18:34) That means our own thoughts and emotions begin to torment us.

10. Forgiveness is like spiritual medicine. When you release someone, you release yourself. You feel lighter, your mind becomes clear, and your heart is filled with peace. The spiritual enemy, Satan and his demons, lose their grip on your soul when you forgive.

11. God's Word says, "Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others." (Colossians 3:13) You don't forgive because the person deserves it—you forgive because you are now a child of God.

12. You may have been deeply hurt. You may have cried and asked God why. But God sees your pain. He understands what you're going through. And He wants to heal your heart. Forgiveness is the first step toward healing and a new beginning.

13. Forgiveness also allows God to work in the life of the person who hurt you. When you forgive, you are not saying that justice doesn't matter. You are simply allowing God to handle it His way and in His time.

14. The forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—want to destroy your relationships, your health, and your faith. But when you choose forgiveness and love, their power is broken. Forgiveness becomes a weapon against darkness.

15. Forgiveness is a powerful seed. When you sow it, you are planting obedience to God's Word. And God promises to bless that seed with a harvest of peace, healing, and freedom in your life.

16. You are not alone. God is with you. He will help you forgive. He will heal your heart. You are not weak for forgiving—you are strong. Love is stronger than hate, and forgiveness is stronger than bitterness.

17. Let go of the weight of the past. You don't have to carry it anymore. Lay it down at the feet of Jesus. Choose to forgive. Choose to live free. Healing begins the moment you make that choice.

18. Tonight could be your night of healing. Don't let unforgiveness block what God wants to do in your life. Ask Him to help you forgive, and you will feel His peace flood your soul. The chains will break, and your life will begin to move forward again.

FORGIVE & LIVE FREE – THE HEALING POWER OF FORGIVENESS

Holding onto pain and anger only keeps us trapped in suffering. But when we choose to forgive, a powerful healing begins inside us. Forgiveness frees our hearts, heals our minds, and brings peace to our souls.

It's not always easy, but forgiveness is a gift we give ourselves. It breaks the chains that the forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—use to hold us captive.

THE GOOD NEWS OF SALVATION: A CHOICE BETWEEN HEAVEN AND HELL Pastor Paul Silway

1. In a world filled with confusion and fear, there is one message that brings peace, hope, and eternal life. This is the Good News of salvation. It tells us how we can be saved from punishment and live forever in Heaven with God.
2. God made people to live with Him forever, but when people chose to sin, they separated themselves from God. This allowed the forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—to bring pain and death into the world.
3. Even though we turned away, God never stopped loving us. He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to save us from sin and from the real enemy, Satan and his demons. Jesus lived without sin, died for us, and rose again to defeat death and darkness.
4. The Bible says that everyone has sinned and falls short of God's glory. But God offers us a free gift: forgiveness and new life through Jesus. We don't have to earn it; we just need to believe and turn from sin.
5. Heaven is full of joy, peace, and love, with no sadness, sickness, or fear. The spiritual enemy, Satan and his demons cannot enter there. Hell, on the other hand, is a place of suffering and separation from God, made for Satan and his demons, but anyone who rejects God's gift chooses to go there.
6. God does not want anyone to be lost. He wants everyone to turn to Him and be saved. That's why He keeps sharing this Good News with the world.
7. You have a choice to make—Heaven or Hell, life or death. God's hand is stretched out in love, ready to save you, not to punish you.
8. If you want to accept this gift today, pray with your heart: "Jesus, I believe You died for me and rose again. Please forgive my sins. I turn from them and accept You as my Savior. Thank You for saving me."
9. When you do this, Heaven celebrates because you become part of God's family. Your name is written in Heaven, and you have eternal life.
10. Remember, Heaven only has Good News, and Hell only has bad news. Choose Jesus every day, follow His Word, and share this Good News with others so they can be saved too. Your decision today matters forever.

SHOULD WE SAY "RIP" OR "REST IN PEACE"? – WHAT THE BIBLE REALLY SAYS Pastor Paul Silway

- 1) Many people write or say “RIP” or “Rest in Peace” when someone dies. Some feel it is a rule, a tradition, or even something they must say. Others write it out of fear, thinking that if they don’t, something bad might happen. But it is important to ask—what does the Bible say about this?
- 2) The letters “RIP” come from the Latin phrase requiescat in pace, which means “may he begin to rest in peace.” This phrase is not found anywhere in the Bible. It started as a man-made tradition, not a command from God.
- 3) Some verses in the Bible speak of “rest” after death for those who followed God. Daniel 12:13 says, “You will rest.” Isaiah 57:2 says, “Those who walk uprightly enter into peace; they find rest as they lie in death.” These show peace for the righteous—but the Bible never tells us to say “Rest in peace” or to pray for someone after they die.
- 4) It is normal to grieve when someone dies. People try to comfort themselves with phrases like, “She’s in a better place,” or “He’s an angel now.” But comfort must come from the truth of God’s Word, not just words that sound nice.
- 5) The Bible says in Hebrews 9:27 that “it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment.” This means once a person dies, their eternity is already decided. We cannot change their destination by praying for them.
- 6) Jesus clearly taught that there are only two eternal places—Heaven or Hell. In Luke 16:19–31, the rich man went to Hell, a place of torment, and the poor man went to paradise. The Bible says in Isaiah 57:21, “There is no peace,” says my God, “for the wicked.”
- 7) If someone has gone to Heaven, they already have full peace. Heaven is a place of perfect peace and joy. You do not need to—and you should not—pray for someone’s peace if they are already in Heaven. They are already with God, in peace forever.
- 8) If someone has gone to Hell, there is no peace at all. Hell is full of torment, pain, and separation from God. You cannot pray for someone in Hell to find peace, because there is no peace in Hell. Prayers for peace cannot change their condition.
- 9) So we must understand this clearly: the living need peace, not the dead. You can pray for peace for people who are still alive—to help them during grief or struggles—but once a person dies, we can no longer pray for them or to them.
- 10) The Bible never tells us to pray for the dead. It never tells us to speak to the dead either. At the moment of death, a person’s eternity is fixed forever—either with God in Heaven or away from Him in Hell.
- 11) The Bible calls those who die in Christ “asleep” because death is only temporary for them. 1 Corinthians 15:20 and 1 Thessalonians 5:10 talk about this. Their bodies may rest in the grave, but their spirits are alive with God. That is true peace.
- 12) Those who belong to Jesus go straight into His presence. 2 Corinthians 5:8 says, “To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord.” Jesus told the man on the cross, “Today you will be with Me in Paradise” (Luke 23:43). That is the peace we should seek while we are alive.

13) Saying “Rest in peace” sounds like a kind prayer, but it is not found in the Bible. In fact, it started as a tradition, not a command. It also acts like a prayer for the dead—which the Bible warns us not to do.

14) We must not follow traditions out of fear, pressure, or habit. If someone didn’t say “RIP,” it doesn’t mean something bad will happen. The Lord looks at our heart and faith—not human customs.

15) What matters most is not what is said after death, but what is believed during life. Each person must decide to receive Jesus while they are alive. After death, it’s too late.

16) Let us not live by fear or follow empty religious customs. Let us speak and live by the truth of God’s Word. That truth brings real peace—not only after death but even now while we are alive.

GOD’S PROTECTION IN CEMETERIES – WHAT REALLY HAPPENS TO THE BODIES OF BELIEVERS AFTER DEATH Pastor Paul Silway

1) Many people wonder if cemeteries are dark or dangerous places filled with evil spirits. They worry if Satan sends his demons to attack or disturb the resting places of the dead. This can make some people feel afraid to visit a cemetery. But the truth is different from what many believe. According to the truth of God’s Word and revelation, cemeteries are not what the enemy focuses on.

2) Satan does not send his demons to cemeteries. Why? Because he knows that only the physical bodies of people are buried there. Their spirits and souls have already left the earth and gone to their eternal destination. The cemetery is just the resting place of the physical body—it is empty of spiritual life.

3) Instead of wasting his resources in cemeteries, Satan focuses all his power and his army of demons on living people. His main goal is to tempt people to sin, to deceive them, and to keep them from the truth of God. He wants to attack minds, destroy faith, and pull people away from God’s plans.

4) But for those who belong to God—those who are born again through faith in Jesus—there is a special kind of heavenly protection even for their physical body after death. Our heavenly Father honors their earthly body, even though the spirit has already gone to Heaven.

5) God sends two special angels—known as Cherub Warfare Angels—to watch over and guard the physical bodies of born-again believers in the cemetery. These are mighty angels of high rank and power. They are not weak or symbolic. They are real and are assigned for a real purpose.

6) These angels remain in their place, standing guard over the graves of the righteous. They are not there to fight demons—because no demons are present in the cemetery—but to honor the person who lived for God. It is part of God’s care and faithfulness, even after the person has left this world.

7) This protection will remain in place at every cemetery where born-again believers are buried. These angels will continue to stand watch until the day of the Resurrection, when the trumpet sounds and the bodies of the righteous will be raised in glory.

8] On that day, the body that was once buried will be transformed into a glorious, eternal body—just like the one Jesus has after His resurrection. The angels are there as heavenly witnesses and protectors, waiting for that great moment of victory and joy.

9) So, if you ever visit the grave of a loved one who was a believer, do not fear. Know that their spirit is already safe with God, and their body is under divine care. No demon has been allowed near them. Only God's angels are there—standing with honor and power.

10) Cemeteries are not places of fear for God's people. They are peaceful places of rest and hope, where the power of God still works. What belongs to God is never forgotten, not even in the grave. His protection and love never end.

WALKING IN PEACE – A GIFT TO CARRY AND SHARE – Pastor Paul Silway

1. God has created this day, and it is full of beauty. Even the clouds in the sky, the gentle breeze, and the quietness of the morning are signs of His goodness. The Lord wants us to pause and notice His presence in the simple things. Every moment is a gift, and we should be grateful for it.

2. When we gather together in His name, He is present among us. His presence brings peace that cannot be explained in human terms. It is not like the peace the world gives. It is a deeper, lasting peace that remains even when there are problems around us.

3. The Bible says, “You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you.” When we fix our thoughts on God, trust Him, and walk with Him daily, His peace fills our hearts and minds.

4. We are not supposed to walk in fear or confusion. Jesus said, “I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don’t be troubled or afraid.”

5. Even when there is trouble in the world—wars, fighting, broken families, and pain—God’s peace is available to us. It’s already done. Jesus purchased this peace with His own blood, and now it belongs to every believer who trusts Him.

6. We should not just receive peace for ourselves but also carry it wherever we go. At work, on the road, in our homes, in schools—everywhere. The spiritual enemy, Satan and his demons, try to bring confusion, fear, and fighting. But we are called to bring peace.

7. Ask yourself: What kind of peace am I giving to my family? What peace am I bringing to my community? Do others see peace in my life, even when there is trouble around me? We should be a living example of the love and peace of God.

8. The Bible says, “Let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts.” That means we must allow peace to be the guide, not anger, not fear, and not doubt. When peace rules our hearts, we respond differently—even in hard times.

9. The forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—want to steal peace from our lives. But they have no right to do so. We belong to God. We carry the fruit of the Spirit in us, and one of those fruits is peace. It’s not something we make; it’s something already inside us.

10. We should ask God daily to awaken the fruit of peace in us. This peace can calm storms in our hearts and bring rest to our minds. As we walk closely with Jesus, His peace grows stronger in us.

11. When people look at you, they should wonder why you are calm when things around you are falling apart. That's the moment you can say, "Because I have the peace of God inside me." That peace is a light in a dark world.

12. We are not weak when we choose peace. We are actually showing strength. God's peace defeats fear. God's peace silences the lies of the spiritual enemy, Satan and his demons. God's peace leads us forward when we don't know what to do.

13. Let us remember this truth: Peace is not just for Sundays or church meetings. It is a lifestyle. We must live in peace, walk in peace, and speak peace daily. Let your mouth speak peaceful words. Let your actions show love.

14. Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." When we choose peace, we are walking like Jesus. We reflect the character of our heavenly Father, and the world notices.

15. So today, don't just ask for peace—receive it. Then give it away. Speak peace over your home. Speak peace over your city. Speak peace over your nation. God's peace is powerful, and it's meant to flow through you.

16. Pray daily, "Lord, help me walk in your peace. Let me bring peace wherever I go. Let your peace be my strength, my guide, and my gift to the world."

THE JOY THAT COMES WITH PERSECUTION – Pastor Paul Silway

(Understanding True Blessing and Joy Through Suffering for Righteousness)

1. In the early hours of the morning, I was awakened and reminded of a hymn I used to sing as a child and teenager in church. The hymn was titled "In the Service of the King." This song was joyful and full of meaning, reminding us that we were serving a loving God with gladness in our hearts.

2. The joy described in that hymn may seem to contrast sharply with the pain of persecution, but they are actually connected. Just like a mother endures pain during childbirth and then experiences joy once her child is born, in the same way, those who are persecuted for living rightly before God can also experience deep joy that outweighs the pain.

3. In Matthew 5:10–12, Jesus gave some powerful and comforting words about being treated badly for doing what is right.

Verse 10 says, "God blesses those who are treated badly for doing what is right, because the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to them."

Verse 11 says, "God blesses you when people insult you, hurt you, and say all kinds of lies about you because you follow Me."

Verse 12 says, "Be happy about it! Be very glad! A great reward is waiting for you in Heaven. People did the same things to the prophets who lived long ago."

4. These verses were not only spoken for that moment in history but are truths meant for all generations. Those who belong to God's family—whether from the Old Testament or New Testament

times—will face persecution. But Jesus taught that even through the pain of persecution, a greater joy is available, both now and eternally.

5. One night, at 1:11 AM, I was awakened again, and I knew it marked a new beginning—a fresh word from the Lord. During that quiet moment, I remembered a powerful scene from a worship service. I saw a portrait-like vision of one of God’s angels. It was not just an image—it was full of emotion and life. The angel looked deeply moved. This memory was from a time when a woman in a wheelchair came to the altar, hoping to be healed. When she didn’t receive her healing, her face showed disappointment and silent pain, perhaps even a sense of spiritual persecution. I saw how the angel responded—with compassion. The expression on the angel’s face reflected sorrow and care. The sadness of the woman touched not only the people present but also the heavenly beings watching over her.

6. Even angels, who are often joyful, experience sorrow when people are hurting. Their presence around us is not only to bring joy but also to minister comfort and love, especially during times of suffering and spiritual battles.

7. Now let us understand what persecution really means. Persecution is not just a future event to fear. While some believe that great persecution will come during the time of the Antichrist and the Great Tribulation (Matthew 24:29–31; Revelation 13), the truth is, persecution is already happening. God’s people are already facing it in many forms across the world.

8. Persecution has always existed. The Hebrew people were persecuted in Egypt for 400 years as slaves. Later, in the time of Queen Esther, the forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—influenced wicked people to try to destroy the Hebrew race (Esther 3:6). These same demonic forces are still active today, trying to harm God's chosen people.

9. Even in the New Testament Church, persecution continues. The spiritual enemy, Satan and his demons, use many ways to cause suffering. One way is by trying to drive God's people away from others, to isolate them and silence them. Many believe Christians should only keep their faith inside the walls of church buildings and not express it in daily life.

10. Another form of persecution is mistreatment that causes mental, emotional, or physical suffering. Sometimes, persecution comes through constantly pressuring believers or placing unreasonable demands on them, all with the goal of discouraging or hurting them.

11. Now let’s understand the word “blessed.” Many define it as having happiness or joy. But it goes deeper than that. Joy is an inner peace and pleasure that comes from God. It stays strong even in painful circumstances. “Rejoice” means to show that inward joy with a smile, laughter, or uplifting words. “Exceeding glad” goes even further, meaning to express this joy in worship and praise to God, to Jesus seated at the right hand of the Father, and to the Holy Spirit (Luke 1:47; 1 Peter 1:8).

12. The purpose of this message is clear: When you are persecuted because you are living for God and doing what is right, you are still blessed. The persecution does not destroy your joy. In fact, it adds to your joy. The forces of darkness—Satan and his demons—may try to steal your peace, but they can never take the deep joy that God has placed in your spirit.

13. So rejoice when you are mocked or mistreated for your faith. You are not alone. God sees your heart. Angels surround you. The Holy Spirit fills you. Your reward in Heaven is great. And above all, the joy that comes from God will carry you through every trial and every persecution.

14. Always remember, the real enemy is not people—it is Satan and his demons. People may say or do hurtful things, but they are often influenced by the forces of darkness. As God's children, we are called to love others, even when they hurt us, and to stay strong in joy through the power of the Holy Spirit.

15. No matter what kind of persecution you face—whether spiritual, emotional, or physical—God has promised that you are blessed. Keep your eyes on Him. Rejoice in His promises. Let your joy be greater than your pain, and know that your faith is precious in His sight.

THE TRUTH ABOUT THE RAPTURE: STAY IN FAITH, NOT FEAR – Pastor Paul Silway

1. Many people today are living in fear and confusion because of what they hear about the Rapture and the end times. The message of the Rapture is often misunderstood. Instead of encouraging faith, it causes fear, hopelessness, and emotional stress.

2. The truth is this: the Rapture is a message about leaving. But God is asking His people to choose to stay and shine His light in the darkness. If your heart is set on leaving, you won't be prepared to fulfill your purpose here on Earth.

3. Think of it this way: who would want to give a job to someone who is always planning to quit? In the same way, God cannot fully use someone who doesn't want to stay. If you keep focusing on leaving, you may never finish the work God called you to do.

4. Satan wants to steal your destiny. He doesn't want you to fulfill it. If you always think about leaving, you may lose your strength to live. Living by faith means choosing to stay strong, to finish your race, and to bring God's glory to this world.

5. In Philippians 1:23, the Apostle Paul said he had a desire to depart and be with Christ, but he also knew it was more important to stay for the sake of others. In verse 25, he made his decision: to remain and help others grow in their faith.

6. Paul had seen Heaven, but still chose to stay. Why? Because he understood that his staying would benefit others. That is true love and maturity. Many believers need to hear this today.

7. Faith can extend your days on earth. Unbelief and constant thoughts of leaving can shorten your life. It's easy to give up, but it takes faith to keep going. You have the power to choose!

8. I am speaking on this topic because many believers are surrounded by fear, gloom, and hopelessness. They are not living with joy. Instead, their hearts are full of sadness and heaviness.

9. I have seen many who listen to doom and gloom messages. Their faces show sorrow. Even their laughter is not real because fear is filling their soul. Depression becomes a stronghold that steals their joy.

10. Depression is not just sadness; it is a spiritual attack. It makes you feel discouraged, fearful, and hopeless. It can open the door to sickness, spiritual dryness, and emotional damage.

11. The enemy uses depression to weaken your faith and keep you from walking in God's plan. But God wants you to be free. He wants you to be filled with His hope, joy, and purpose.

12. God does not want you to live in fear. Fear is faith in reverse. Fear is believing the lies of the enemy instead of the promises of God. When fear controls you, you cannot pray or act in faith.

13. I have seen how many Christians are living under stress and pressure. Some are heavily burdened, and others have mild stress—but they all feel stuck. They don't know how to be free, so they turn to worldly ways to cope.

14. Sadly, many believers are trapped by teachings that only bring fear about the last days. They are being controlled by fear instead of being led by the Spirit of God.

15. Years ago, I witnessed a group of believers under fear-based control. They copied everything their leader did because they were afraid. This is not God's way. This is the spirit of fear and manipulation.

16. Deception has power—that's why Satan uses it. Even educated people can be deceived if they believe fear-based teachings. The more you accept deception, the harder it is to see the truth.

17. Jesus warned His disciples in Luke 21:8, "Take heed that you be not deceived." This warning was repeated in Matthew 24:4 and Mark 13:5. Why? Because deception is one of Satan's strongest tools in the last days.

18. The worst part of deception is that you don't know you are being deceived. That's why it is so dangerous. But when truth comes, the power of deception breaks. Truth always brings freedom.

19. Many believers who focus only on end-time fear messages are experiencing emotional pain—depression, hopelessness, confusion, and sadness. They don't know how to pray in faith because fear has taken over their hearts.

20. You can be free. But only revelation truth can set you free. If someone is speaking out of fear, they cannot help you become free because fear itself is a bondage.

21. The Bible says in John 8:32, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." That means only those who speak by revelation and truth from God's Word can truly help you walk in freedom.

22. Listen to the full message about the Rapture and the end times with an open heart. Don't let fear steal your purpose. Let the light of truth fill your heart.

23. Remember this: a fearful person cannot serve God fully. Fear paralyzes. Faith activates. If you want to walk in victory and complete your destiny, choose faith over fear, truth over deception, and life over escape.

LIVING WITH HEAVEN'S POWER By Pastor Paul Silway

You don't have to live life alone or weak. God gives His power to help you live in victory every day.

1. God never meant for you to live by your own strength. He created you to walk with Him and receive help from Heaven every day. (Romans 8:11)
2. The Holy Spirit lives in you. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is in every believer. That's not a feeling—it's real, living power.
3. You don't have to stay in fear, addiction, or depression. God gives you power, love, and a sound mind. (2 Timothy 1:7)
4. Heaven's power is for your everyday life. It helps you forgive, choose what's right, love your enemies, and say no to sin.
5. You cannot win spiritual battles without God's power. That's why God said, "Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit." (Zechariah 4:6)
6. The spiritual enemy fears God's power in you. When you stay close to God, demons cannot defeat you. They run from the power in you.
7. Your prayers connect Heaven and Earth. When you pray in faith, God listens and Heaven responds. (James 5:16)
8. You have authority in Jesus' name. Your words carry spiritual power. When you speak God's Word, darkness is pushed back. (Proverbs 18:21)
9. Keep your eyes on Jesus. Don't focus on problems. Jesus is your strength. (Hebrews 12:2)
10. Stay strong and don't be afraid. God is with you. Be bold and courageous in every battle. (Joshua 1:9)
11. You were born for this time. God uses ordinary people who say "yes" to Him. (Isaiah 6:8)
12. You are the light of the world. Your kindness and truth shine in dark places. You carry hope and healing. (Matthew 5:14)
13. Don't stop praying. Even if things look hard, keep going. Your prayers are changing things. (1 Thessalonians 5:17)
14. Live expecting miracles. God still does amazing things today. Believe Him for more. (Matthew 19:26)
15. Let Heaven's power flow through you. Say, "God, I need Your Spirit. I want to live in Your power every day." He will fill you.

THE BLESSING OF ENDURING PERSECUTION WHILE WAITING FOR CHRIST'S RETURN — Pastor Paul Silway

- 1) The Bible says, “Behold, I come quickly: blessed is he that keepeth the sayings of the prophecy of this book.” (Revelation 22:7). This is a promise from Jesus that He will return soon. Those who believe this and obey what is written in the Book of Revelation are blessed.
- 2) The Holy Spirit wants us to understand that this verse is about a specific New Testament prophecy—the return of Christ from Heaven. This is not about prophecy in general, but about the truth that Jesus will come again soon. Those who believe this and stay faithful, even in persecution, will be blessed.
- 3) When Christians face persecution for their faith, it is often painful and difficult. But when they endure with the hope of Jesus’ return, they are counted as happy and blessed. Their eyes are not fixed on the suffering but on the glorious day when Jesus will come again.
- 4) Revelation 22:13 says, “I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the first and the last.” These words remind us that Jesus began the history of the world, and He will also bring it to an end. When He returns, He will separate the righteous from the wicked.
- 5) Revelation 1:7 says, “Behold, he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him, and they also which pierced him: and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him. Even so, Amen.” When Jesus returns, it will not be a secret. Every person alive on Earth will see Him coming with the clouds.
- 6) The return of Jesus will happen at a specific moment in time, chosen by the Father. It will be sudden and visible to all. Even those who hated or rejected Him will see Him and will mourn because they know they will face judgment.
- 7) Matthew 24:14 says, “And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come.” Before Jesus returns, the Good News about Him will be preached everywhere. No one will be without a chance to hear and believe.
- 8] Matthew 13:49 says, “So shall it be at the end of the world: the angels shall come forth, and sever the wicked from among the just.” When Jesus returns, angels will assist in separating those who belong to Him from those who have rejected Him.
- 9) During His first coming, angels observed His birth. But during His second coming, they will take action. They will help Jesus by separating the wicked from the righteous. The righteous will be gathered to Jesus, and the wicked will be removed and judged.
- 10) Revelation 1:7 also says people will wail when Jesus returns. This will include those who heard the Gospel but still rejected it. When they see Jesus, they will realize too late that the time for choosing has ended. Their sorrow will be great, for judgment is coming.
- 11) The Bible reveals that before Jesus returns, Satan will create a temporary two-part kingdom. This includes a worldwide government led by the Antichrist, and a false religious system pretending to be the true Church. This will be shown clearly in Revelation chapters 17 and 18.
- 12) But this false kingdom will not last. Revelation 21:1 to 22:5 shows that Jesus will return and defeat the kingdom of darkness. First, He will rule on Earth for 1,000 years in the Millennial Kingdom with His people. After that, God will make a new Heaven and a new Earth.

13) This is the final victory of God. The kingdom of Satan will be completely destroyed, and a new, perfect world will be created. Jesus will reign forever with His people, and there will be no more sin, sorrow, or death.

14) In summary, here are three powerful truths to remember: First, Christians who suffer persecution are helping spread the Gospel across the world. Second, their faithfulness through suffering is part of God's plan to bring Earth's history to a close. Third, knowing these truths brings deep joy and strength even in the hardest times.

15) Those who hold on in faith, who endure persecution while looking for Christ's return, are truly blessed. Their reward is not only in Heaven but also in the peace they carry now, knowing that they are part of God's eternal plan.

TRUE GIVING BRINGS TRUE BLESSINGS Pastor Paul Silway

1) Many people think that only the rich should give money to God, and that the poor are not required to give. But the truth is, everyone should give—rich or poor. Giving is not about the amount, but about the heart. Giving brings blessings. When you give with faith, you open the door for God to bless you.

2) One day, Jesus entered a synagogue—which today we would call a church. He saw many people putting money into the offering box. Rich people gave large amounts. But there was also a poor widow who had only two small coins. She also put them into the offering box.

3) Jesus saw her giving, and He paid special attention to her. He said that while the rich gave out of their extra money, this poor widow gave everything she had. She didn't keep anything for herself. What she gave may have looked small in the eyes of people, but it was very big in the eyes of God.

4) Now think about this—Jesus could have stopped her. He could have said, "You are poor, you don't need to give. Keep your coins for food." But He didn't. He allowed her to give. Why? Because God cannot bless what we keep—He blesses what we give.

5) There is no money in Heaven. The way blessings are released is by giving here on Earth. The Bible says, "Give, and it shall be given to you." Yes, blessings may come through people, but behind every blessing is God Himself, working in your favor.

6) If you want to be financially blessed, you must learn to give. There is a scripture that says: "There is one who gives freely, and yet becomes richer; and there is one who withholds too much, and yet becomes poor." Holding back leads to lack. Giving leads to abundance.

7) If blessings came just by asking, then no one would need to give. But God has set a spiritual law in place: giving opens the way for receiving. The act of giving breaks the power of money over your life. It removes the love of money and teaches your heart to trust God.

8] Money tries to control people. It can create fear, greed, or selfishness. But giving breaks that control. It sets you free. When you give, you are saying, "God, I trust You more than I trust my money." And that kind of trust always brings reward.

9) So whether you are rich or poor, young or old, learn to give. Don't wait until you have a lot. Start with what you have. Just like that poor widow woman who gave her two coins, your giving may look small—but in God's eyes, it is great faith. And faith moves Heaven.

10) Don't be afraid to give. Trust God, honor Him with your giving, and watch how He blesses you. Giving is not losing—it is planting. And every seed planted in faith will always bring a harvest.

3. The world praises success, popularity, and power. But Heaven honors obedience, love, and humility. God is not impressed by how many people know you. He looks at how much you love Him and others.

4. Before we talk more about greatness, we must understand the most important miracle—salvation. Salvation is not something you earn by doing good deeds, fasting, crying, or praying hard. It is a free gift from God, given because of His love for you.

5. You are saved when you hear the Good News of Jesus, believe it, and receive Him as your Lord and Savior. At that moment, your name is written in the Book of Life in Heaven, and you become a child of God.

6. Now, you are not just a believer—you are a citizen of Heaven. The Holy Spirit lives in you and helps you live for God every day. You are part of God's family.

HOW TO BE GREAT IN GOD'S KINGDOM – 19 SIMPLE POINTS

7. ANYONE IN GOD'S FAMILY CAN BE GREAT

You don't have to be a pastor or famous to be great in God's Kingdom. If you love others, pray quietly, help behind the scenes, and do good when no one sees you, Heaven calls that greatness. God sees your heart.

8. HUMBLE YOURSELF LIKE A CHILD

11. TEACH OTHERS BY YOUR EXAMPLE

You may not be a preacher, but your life can be a message. When you live with love, patience, and truth, people learn from you. Teach with your actions.

12. BE FAITHFUL IN SMALL THINGS

God sees every small act of kindness and obedience. Luke 16:10 says, "Whoever is faithful in little will also be faithful in much." In Heaven, small things matter.

13. WALK IN LOVE ALWAYS

Even if you do many good things, without love it means nothing (1 Corinthians 13). Love your family, neighbors, and even your enemies. That is true greatness.

14. FORGIVE QUICKLY AND FULLY

Great people in the Kingdom forgive easily. God has forgiven us, so we must forgive others too. Holding on to anger does not make you great—letting go does.

15. LIVE TO PLEASE GOD, NOT PEOPLE

Don't do good things to show off or gain praise. Do them to honor God. Jesus said those who do good to be seen by others already have their reward (Matthew 6:1).

16. LET THE HOLY SPIRIT LEAD YOU

Don't try to be great by your own strength. Let the Holy Spirit guide you every day. He will help you walk in obedience, love, and truth.

17. BE PURE IN HEART

Jesus said, "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God" (Matthew 5:8). A pure heart is not proud, jealous, or angry—it is full of peace and love.

18. USE YOUR GIFTS TO BUILD OTHERS UP

Whatever gift God has given you—teaching, singing, helping, praying—use it to bless others. Don't keep your gift hidden. Use it with love and joy.

19. LIVE WITH ETERNITY IN MIND

This world is temporary, but Heaven is forever. Live every day with your eyes on eternity. Make choices that matter in the Kingdom of God.

FINAL THOUGHT

Anyone can be great in God's Kingdom—whether you are known or unknown, seen or unseen. God sees your heart. If you walk in love, obey His Word, and live humbly, Heaven will call you great.

HOW TO BALANCE DOCTORS, MEDICINES & BIBLE HEALING

(Simple Truths About How God Heals) By Pastor Paul Silway)

1. HOW SICKNESS CAME

Sickness entered the world because of sin, but Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil. He wants us to live in health—spirit, soul, and body.

“By His wounds we are healed.” – Isaiah 53:5

2. JESUS IS THE TRUE HEALER

Jesus is our healer. He carried our sicknesses on the cross. Healing is a gift that comes from Him.

“I am the Lord who heals you.” – Exodus 15:26

3. HEALING COMES BY FAITH

Like the woman who touched Jesus' robe, faith brings healing. When we believe, we receive.

“Your faith has made you well.” – Mark 5:34

4. GOD HEALS THROUGH HEALTHY LIVING

God gives wisdom to take care of our body. Eat healthy, sleep well, avoid stress, exercise, and keep your soul clean. Joy and peace also bring healing.

“As your soul prospers, you will be in health.” – 3 John 1:2

5. GOD HEALS THROUGH HIS WORD

The Word of God has healing power. When we hear and believe the Word, it brings life and health.

“He sent His Word and healed them.” – Psalm 107:20

6. GOD USES MEDICINES

Medicine is not against faith. God gives wisdom to make it. When taken with prayer, it can help healing.

“Apply the fig paste... and he recovered.” – Isaiah 38:21

7. GOD WORKS THROUGH DOCTORS

Doctors are a blessing, especially when faith is still growing. Jesus said the sick need a doctor. Don’t be ashamed to go to one.

“He bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine.” – Luke 10:34

8. DON’T JUDGE PEOPLE WHO TAKE MEDICINE

The woman with the issue of blood had seen many doctors. Jesus didn’t criticize her—He healed her. Some begin with medicine, and later grow in faith.

“She had suffered under many doctors... Jesus said, ‘Your faith has made you well.’” – Mark 5:26,34

9. HEALING CAN BE INSTANT OR SLOW

Sometimes God heals quickly, sometimes slowly. All healing—whether by prayer, medicine, or time—is from God.

“Every good and perfect gift is from above.” – James 1:17

10. IN SOME CASES, HEALING HAPPENS IN HEAVEN

Sometimes, healing comes when a believer goes to be with Jesus. There is no pain, no sickness, only peace and joy in Heaven. That’s still healing—eternal healing.

“God will wipe away every tear... there will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain.” – Revelation 21:4

11. TRUST GOD'S WISDOM AND TIMING

Keep praying and believing for healing. But also trust God’s way and His timing. Whether healing happens now, slowly, or through going home to Heaven, God keeps His promise.

12. GIVE JESUS THE GLORY ALWAYS

No matter how healing comes—by faith, by medicine, or by miracle—thank Jesus. He is the true healer.

“In everything give thanks.” – 1 Thessalonians 5:18

“I am the Lord who heals you.” – Exodus 15:26

FINAL WORD:

Don’t judge. Don’t fear. Trust Jesus. Healing comes from Him in many ways. Let faith grow, and always give Him the glory!

WHY DO SOME WICKED PEOPLE LIVE LONG WHILE THE GOOD DIE YOUNG?

- 1) Many people struggle with this question: Why do some people who live in wickedness enjoy long lives, while those who are good and righteous sometimes die early? It seems unfair, especially when we see evil people prosper and godly people suffer. But if we go deeper into God's Word, we begin to understand.
- 2) God is not pleased with evil, and He does not reward wickedness. However, He is full of mercy and patience. When evil people live longer, it is not because God supports their actions. It is because He is giving them more time to turn away from their sins and come to Him. He is giving them one last opportunity to repent.
- 3) This life on earth is the only time a person has to choose their eternal future. After death, there is no more chance to repent. Once someone dies, their spirit faces judgment. That's why God's mercy allows even the wicked more time—to give them a final chance to make the right decision.
- 4) Some people wrongly think they are safe just because they are not punished right away. They may enjoy worldly success and believe that nothing bad will happen to them, even though they live in sin. But what they do not realize is that God is not ignoring their actions—He is showing them mercy, hoping they will change before it's too late.
- 5) God's love is deep and patient. He waits for people to repent. But His waiting is not forever. If a person keeps rejecting His love, His truth, and His voice, the day will come when their time will be over. After that, nothing can be done to change their eternity.
- 6) When a good person dies young, it does not mean they have failed. Often, they have fulfilled their purpose on this earth. God may take them home early to protect them from future trouble or to reward them with everlasting joy in Heaven. Their death is not a defeat—it is a gain in the spirit.
- 7) The Bible tells us in 2 Peter 3:9, "The Lord is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance." This verse shows clearly that God's mercy is the reason many are given more time. Even those who are living far from Him are still being shown love.
- 8] We must never become jealous of the wicked who live long or seem to enjoy success. Psalm 37:1–2 says, "Do not fret because of evildoers, nor be envious of the workers of iniquity. For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb." Their future is not secure unless they repent.
- 9) Instead of asking why they live long, we should trust God's wisdom and timing. God sees the end from the beginning. His justice will come at the right time. Until then, His heart is still waiting in love. Our job is to pray for those who are lost so that they turn to God before their time runs out.
- 10) If you are reading this and have not yet fully surrendered to God, this is your moment. Do not ignore it. Every day of life is a gift from God. Use it to choose what is right. Choose truth. Choose eternal life. Choose Jesus—before your chance is gone forever.

BREAK FREE FROM THE SPIRIT OF FEAR - Pastor Paul Silway

- 1) In today's world, we are surrounded by negative news and frightening information. Many people hear constant reports about sickness, disasters, financial trouble, and danger. This has caused fear to grow in the hearts of people—especially those who are not strong in the Word of God. There is a

difference between being concerned about something and allowing fear to control your words and thoughts. When fear takes over, it becomes dangerous.

2) During difficult times like the pandemic, many people have experienced changes in their thinking and spiritual life. Some have turned back to God. Others who were once careless about their relationship with Him began to seek Him seriously. In many ways, the difficult season brought correction and new awareness to people's hearts.

3) Still, the effects of such hard seasons have left people feeling overwhelmed. Adults and children alike have faced stress and fear. These emotions do not come from God. They are weapons of the enemy meant to steal our peace and destroy our joy. The fear of sickness, death, and uncertainty has weighed heavily on people.

4) Fear and stress are powerful tools of darkness. They are among the biggest causes of depression, heart attacks, and even early death. The constant sight of masks, fearful news reports, ambulance sirens, and images of death and suffering have filled people's minds with fear. These pictures feed fear day and night until it becomes a flood of anxiety inside.

5) Many have reached out asking for prayer. People have felt physical symptoms like chest pain, shortness of breath, and fast heartbeats. Yet when doctors check them, they find nothing wrong in their body. What they are facing is fear—not sickness. Fear is tormenting them in their mind and body.

6) One woman was troubled about her weight. She kept saying, "I'm afraid I will never lose this weight." It wasn't just concern—it was fear. Her fear opened the door to more fears. This is how fear works. It begins with one small thought, and if you allow it to grow, it opens the door to other fears that will try to take over your life.

7) Another person broke down in tears and said, "I'm afraid my husband will leave me. I'm afraid I will be alone. I'm afraid I will die early." None of these things had happened. There was no reason to believe they would. Yet, fear had already convinced her heart that these things were true. She was living in torment, not because of what happened, but because of what she feared might happen.

8] This is how the enemy works. He uses fear to create pictures in your mind of things that are not even real. These fears may be about sickness, poverty, rejection, failure, harm to children, or fear of dying alone. But these are all lies from the enemy. As long as you accept fear, you will be trapped by it.

9) Fear is not just a feeling—it is a spirit. The Bible clearly tells us in 2 Timothy 1:7, "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." This verse shows us that fear is not from God. It is from the enemy. God gives us power, love, and a sound, peaceful mind. Fear is a spiritual attack meant to destroy that peace.

10) If you are a child of God, fear has no right to stay in your life. God's Word is full of promises that protect us from fear. When you fill your heart and mouth with the truth of God's Word, fear begins to leave. You must stand strong and refuse to accept fear, even in your thoughts. Do not let fear speak through your words. Replace fear with faith.

11) This is the time to rise up and fight back. Do not allow fear to live in your home, your body, or your mind. Speak the Word of God. Declare His promises of protection, healing, provision, and peace. Refuse to let fear steal your joy, your health, or your future.

12) You were never created to live in fear. You were created to live in peace, in joy, and in God's love. The spirit of fear is defeated when you believe and speak what God says. Choose faith over fear. Choose life over worry. Choose peace over torment.

13) Let the words of Isaiah 41:10 comfort you today: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you." You are not alone. God is with you. And with Him, you have nothing to fear.

Declare today:

I refuse to live in fear. Fear has no place in me. I have the Spirit of power, love, and a sound mind. God is with me, and I will not be afraid. In Jesus' name, Amen.

A CALL TO EVERY PASTOR AND MINISTRY LEADER

Every pastor, leader, and congregation is kindly encouraged to take a few moments in every Sunday service—or during any gathering of your church—to pray together in one accord and in agreement regarding the ongoing persecution of believers and churches.

Let every believer join in unity—because when the Church prays, God acts!
Let's keep this fire of prayer burning until victory is seen.

POWERFUL PRAYER FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH & FOR THE PERSECUTORS

(To be prayed together by pastors, leaders, and congregations everywhere)

1. Heavenly Father, in the name of Jesus Christ, we come before You as one family of believers, united in Spirit and truth. We thank You for the blood of Jesus, the power of the Holy Spirit, and the authority of Your Word that never fails. We come not in fear, but in faith.

2. Lord, we lift up every pastor, every church, and every believer facing persecution today. Strengthen them, cover them, empower them, and surround them with angels. We declare Psalm 91 over them—that no evil shall befall them and no plague shall come near their dwelling. You are their Refuge and Fortress.

3. Father, we also bring before You those who are persecuting the Church—knowingly or unknowingly. Whether influenced by the enemy, tradition, fear, jealousy, or ignorance, we ask You to touch their hearts. Let the light of the Gospel shine into their darkness. Save them, convict them, and transform them by Your mercy.

4. We declare that persecution cannot stop the Church—but will instead cause it to grow, to expand, and to shine brighter. As in the book of Acts, let boldness come upon every believer to preach the Word with signs following. Let miracles break out. Let many come to know Jesus.

5. Lord, we pray for unity among all Your ministers—regardless of denomination, title, or position. May no one look down upon another. You said, “I will build My Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.” (Matthew 16:18)

8. We ask You to expose every hidden work of darkness—every bribery, false accusation, manipulation, or betrayal done to harm Your ministers and churches. Let justice and mercy flow like rivers. Let no weapon formed against Your people prosper. (Isaiah 54:17)

9. We declare over every pastor and church leader—wisdom, boldness, supernatural provision, protection, angelic help, and divine favor. They will not faint, fall, or fear. They will stand strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. (Ephesians 6:10).

10. And now, Lord, we declare together in faith that persecution will not have the final word—Jesus will. We declare victory, breakthrough, and revival! Let the fire of the Holy Spirit fall again on churches across every city, state, and nation.

11. Let pastors and people pray together regularly. Let Sunday services be filled not only with preaching, but also with passionate prayer for the persecuted Church and for the persecutors to be saved. Let this continue until persecution is pushed back and peace comes again.

12. We believe it, we speak it, and we receive it—in Jesus’ mighty name. Amen!

A LOVING MESSAGE FROM JESUS – YOUR SAVIOUR AND LORD – Pastor Paul Silway

I am Jesus. I am the Lord God. I am called "The Word" in Heaven. I came to Earth because I love all people — every man, woman, and child.

1. My Father in Heaven sent Me on a very important mission — to save mankind from the penalty of sin.

2. In the beginning, when God made man, there was no sin in him. He was pure and we had close fellowship with him. But long ago, before Earth was created, one of the angels in Heaven — Lucifer — became proud. He wanted to take our throne and become like God. That pride turned into rebellion.

3. Because of his sin, we removed him from Heaven forever. He became Satan, the enemy of God and man. Sadly, many other angels followed him, and they too were cast out.

4. Then We created Earth and gave it to man. Man was sinless and we walked with him in love. But Satan came to Earth and tempted man. Man listened to his voice instead of Mine — and sin entered into the human race.

5. Sin broke our relationship. It damaged man's soul and separated him from us and from Heaven. That's why we had to send man out of the Garden of Eden — because light and darkness cannot stay together.

6. But we didn't stop loving mankind. That's why My Father sent Me to Earth — to rescue and restore what was lost. I came down and became a man, born through a virgin — a miraculous birth without the seed of man — because sin passes through man's seed.

7. I lived a sinless life and died on the cross — not for My sins, but for yours. I carried the punishment for the sins of the world, so that anyone who believes in Me could be forgiven.

8. The law of Heaven says, "The wages of sin is death." That's why I had to die — to pay that price. And now, forgiveness and salvation are offered freely as a gift to anyone who believes.

9. But Satan didn't stop lying. He started false religions to tell people that they could reach Heaven through good works. He doesn't want people to follow Me or go to Heaven, because he is judged for Hell. Through lies, he binds people in darkness. But My truth sets people free.

10. Now each person must choose: Will you believe Satan's lie or believe My truth? I made salvation simple. You don't have to pay for it, earn it, or be perfect. Just believe in Me before your life ends. After death, no one can make that choice.

11. I never force Myself into anyone's life. If My followers force or bribe others, I still cannot enter their hearts — because the door only opens from the inside. I wait patiently at every heart's door. When you open it to Me, I will come in, forgive you, and give you a new heart, a new life, and a new identity as My child.

12. I am God. I am just, holy, righteous, and full of truth. I do not deceive. I cannot work in a heart full of hate, because hate belongs to the devil. I work only in hearts that receive My love.

13. My people cannot convert anyone — only I can save. Their job is simply to speak the truth. If anyone believes, I enter their heart, write their name in Heaven, and give them citizenship in My Kingdom.

14. Don't listen to Satan's lies. He is behind hate, violence, division, persecution, and fear. I am love — and from Me comes peace, joy, unity, forgiveness, grace, and eternal life.

15. Before you leave this Earth, please know: We love you. Whether you are rich or poor, educated or not, from any country or language — My salvation is for everyone. Heaven is not for sale. You cannot buy it with money or good deeds. It is a gift.

16. I am the only Savior of the world — because I, being God, became a man and died for your sins. I was born without sin, lived without sin, and on the cross, I carried all the sins of mankind. I paid it all — so now, anyone can be saved and become a child of God.

17. Heaven is your true home — a place with no sin, no darkness, no sorrow, no sickness, no old age, no death, and no lack. The streets are made of gold. You will be joyful forever, and I will be your Father forever.

18. So I lovingly ask you: Don't leave this Earth without knowing this truth. Make the decision now, before it's too late. I am waiting for you — with open arms.

Title: THE ONLY SIN THAT SENDS PEOPLE TO HELL – Pastor Paul Silway

1. Some people think that if someone drinks alcohol, smokes, or uses tobacco, they will automatically go to Hell. But this is not what the Bible teaches. Those things can certainly harm your body and mind. They can weaken your ability to think clearly, making it harder for you to choose to follow God. That is exactly what the enemy wants—to numb your mind so you won't hear or respond to God's voice. But doing those things is not what sends someone to Hell.

2. The truth is simple: the only sin that sends a person to Hell is rejecting Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Every other sin—lying, stealing, murder, sexual sin—has already been paid for by Jesus through His death and resurrection. God's forgiveness is big enough for every sin. What He cannot forgive is when someone refuses to believe in Jesus and rejects the only way of salvation.

3. Jesus said in John 16:8–9, “When [the Holy Spirit] comes, He will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin... in regard to sin, because they do not believe in Me.” According to this verse, the sin the Holy Spirit convicts people of is not believing in Jesus. That is the sin that separates people from God forever.

4. Many people ask, “What about terrible sins like murder or homosexuality?” But God is ready to forgive every kind of sin—big or small—because Jesus already paid the price for all sin. The only sin that remains unforgiven is rejecting the Holy Spirit’s invitation to accept Jesus. This is what the Bible calls blasphemy against the Holy Spirit (Mark 3:29)—saying no to the Spirit’s call to salvation.

5. At the end of life, when someone stands before God, He will not ask, “Did you live a perfect life?” He will ask one question: “Did you make My Son Jesus the Lord of your life?” If the answer is no, that person will be judged not for every mistake they made, but for rejecting the free gift of salvation through Jesus.

6. The Bible makes it clear in Romans 3:23, “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.” That means no one is perfect. And Romans 6:23 says, “For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Eternal life is a gift—you cannot earn it. You can only receive it by faith in Jesus.

7. We are not sinners because we commit sin; we are sinners because we were born into sin after Adam disobeyed God. In the same way, we are not made righteous because we do everything right. We are made righteous because Jesus is righteous, and we receive His righteousness by believing in Him.

8. Under the Law in the Old Testament, if someone broke even one rule, they were guilty of breaking all of it (James 2:10). But under grace in the New Testament, if someone does one thing right—put their faith in Jesus—they are made right in every way. That is the power of God’s grace. And nothing you do can make you lose your salvation—unless you stop trusting in Jesus and reject Him completely.

9. God's grace is not just an idea. It's not a word in an old book. Grace is a person—Jesus Christ, the Son of God. When you draw near to Him, grace comes near to you. The Bible says in James 4:8, "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you."

10. Today, you can make the most important decision of your life. Jesus has already paid for every sin. He offers you the gift of salvation, peace, and eternal life. But you must choose Him while you're alive. Once life ends, there is no second chance. Hell is not for people who made mistakes—it is for those who refused Jesus, the only Savior.

CONCLUSION:

God doesn't send people to Hell because of their bad behavior. He sends no one there by force. People go to Hell because they reject Jesus. That is the only sin that has eternal consequences. Accept Jesus today, and receive the gift of grace that He freely offers. Heaven is ready for all who believe.

TRUE PRAYER—SEEN BY GOD, NOT MEN – PASTOR PAUL SILWAY

Are You Praying to Be Seen or to Be Heard by the Father?

1. Many people are comfortable praying in public—whether in church, at gatherings, or in front of others. They may pray loudly, with passion, or with strong emotions. But the real question is not how much we pray in front of others, but how much time we spend with God when we are alone.

2. Jesus clearly said that our Father sees us when we go into our room, shut the door, and pray in secret. That kind of prayer is not for show. It is a heart-to-heart connection with God—away from people, noise, and attention.

"When you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father... will reward you." – Matthew 6:6

3. There is a big difference between the OUTER LIFE of prayer and the INNER LIFE of prayer. The outer life is what people see. The inner life is what only God sees. The Father values the quiet, secret time more than the show in public.

4. Some may judge you if they don't see you praying loudly or publicly. They might think you're spiritually weak. But those who spend much time alone with God in quiet prayer are the ones who truly carry His presence.

5. It's not wrong to pray in public. But it becomes dangerous when we focus only on being seen by people. That kind of prayer seeks attention, not God. And it doesn't impress Heaven, even if it impresses people.

"They love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others." – Matthew 6:5

6. There are also people who use dramatic expressions in prayer—crying loudly, shouting, trembling, or making sounds—just to make others think they are powerful or anointed. This may move immature believers, but it does not move God.

7. Some pray long prayers even for small things—like a meal. They begin by blessing the food, then pray for the cook, the family, and eventually for the city and nation—so long that the food becomes cold.

“When you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans... your Father knows what you need before you ask Him.” – Matthew 6:7–8

8. What God desires is simple: a heart full of faith. A short prayer spoken with faith and authority is more powerful than a long emotional prayer made to stir up tears. True prayer is based on faith, not emotion.

9. Some people think a prayer is powerful only if it makes them cry or shake. But tears and shaking do not prove God is moving. Real faith doesn’t need outward signs to believe that God has heard and answered.

10. Prayer is not a performance. It's a relationship. You don't need to impress God. You just need to talk to Him sincerely, whether it is silent or spoken aloud. What matters is your heart.

11. Let us not be fooled by outward appearances. Let's not be quick to praise a loud prayer, nor judge a quiet one. What we need is truth and faith in the presence of our loving Father.

12. True spiritual strength is found in those who pray more in secret than in public. Those who walk closely with God behind the scenes carry His power openly—without needing to prove anything.

“The Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you openly.” – Matthew 6:6

DON'T WORRY — GOD IS IN CONTROL — PASTOR PAUL SILWAY

1. Life can often feel uncertain. Sometimes things happen suddenly, and we don't understand why. It may look like everything is going wrong, and it feels like you have no control over anything. But the truth is — you don't need to be in control because God is.

2. When your heart feels anxious, remember this — God has a plan. He knew everything about your life before you were even born. Jeremiah 29:11 says, “For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans to give you hope and a future.” His plans are good, even if things don't look good right now.

3. Worrying will not change anything. Jesus clearly said in Matthew 6:27, “Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?” The answer is no. Worry steals your peace, but trust gives you strength.

4. God wants you to trust Him even when you don't understand what's going on. That's what real faith is — believing that God is working behind the scenes, even when you can't see it. 2 Corinthians 5:7 says, “We walk by faith, not by sight.”

5. You might think, “I don't know how this will turn out.” But you don't need all the answers — you just need to know the One who does. God is never late, never weak, and never confused. He is your loving Father, and He cares about every detail of your life.

6. The more you focus on God, the smaller your problems will feel. Fix your eyes on Him. Praise Him in the storm. Thank Him even when you don't see the answer yet. That's when you will rise above the storm and walk in victory.

7. Worrying doesn't solve anything. It doesn't fix the problem, and it doesn't give you peace. In fact, worry makes things worse. It steals your strength, weakens your faith, and takes your eyes off God.

8. Don't be discouraged. Don't give up. Don't let fear or worry control your heart. Remember: you are not alone, and you are not helpless. God is with you. He is working for your good.

DON'T MISS THE ONLY SAVIOR – HE LOVES YOU DEEPLY – Pastor Paul Silway

1. God loves you just as you are. He does not wait for you to become perfect or good before He loves you. He is not a God who has love—He is love. Even if you don't like Him, He still loves you. If you reject Him, curse Him, or even tear His Word, His love for you will not stop. His love never quits, because it is not based on what you do—it is who He is.

2. But even though God loves you with an everlasting love, that love cannot save you unless you receive it. Love must be accepted. God has already made a way for your salvation, but He will never force Himself on you. His love will always reach out to you, but you must respond. The Bible says in John 1:12, “But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God.”

3. Even if you keep rejecting Him again and again, He will still keep reaching out to you. He works gently, not with force, but with love. There are people—maybe family, maybe strangers—praying for your salvation. Heaven wants you. God wants to save you. But there is also an enemy—the devil—who wants to stop you from choosing Jesus. He tries to confuse your mind, bring doubt, or keep you busy and distracted.

4. Heaven and hell both want your soul, but neither can force you. Your will is the highest authority God respects. He gave you the power to choose. God will never override your free will. But He will keep knocking on the door of your heart, again and again, using His Word and the prayers of others. The Bible says in Revelation 3:20, “Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in.”

5. The door of your heart has a latch only on the inside. You must choose to open it. Jesus will not force His way in. He is gentle and patient. He knows He is the only way to save you. And even if you reject Him all your life, He will still keep following you until your final breath. He wants no one to be lost in Hell forever.

6. The Bible says in 2 Peter 3:9, “The Lord is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.” That is His heart. He already paid for all your sins when He suffered and died on the cross. He carried your punishment, and His blood has the power to cleanse every sin. He offers you forgiveness freely. But it must be received by faith.

7. If you die after rejecting Him, the door closes forever. There is no second chance after death. This life is the only time you have to make your decision. That is why it is urgent. Now is the time to believe in Jesus as your Savior and Lord. He is the only Savior in the world, because He is the only one who paid the full price for sin.

8. A savior must be without sin. But every human being is born in sin. That is why no one else can be your savior—not a prophet, not a teacher, not a religion. Romans 3:10 says, “There is no one righteous, not even one.” Sin is not just what you do—it is what you are born into. You are not a sinner because you sin; you sin because you are a sinner.

9. The sinful nature is passed down from generation to generation through the seed of man. But Jesus was not born of man’s seed. He was born of a virgin by the power of the Holy Spirit. His birth was a miracle, untouched by the sin nature. That is why He could live without sin and offer Himself as the perfect sacrifice. Hebrews 4:15 says that He “was tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin.”

10. Jesus is the only one who was ever born sinless and lived without sin. That’s why He alone can save you. If you miss Him, you will die in your sins. The Bible warns in John 8:24, “If you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins.” There is no other Savior. No one else has the power to take away your sins. Don’t wait, don’t delay, and don’t reject the love of God that is reaching out to you right now.

CONCLUSION:

God’s love is eternal. It never stops reaching out. But love must be received to change your life. Jesus is calling you even now. Open your heart to Him. Say yes to the only Savior who died for you and rose again. Don’t miss Him—because if you miss Him, you miss everything.

Title: Your Eternal Home—Choose Before It’s Too Late – Pastor Paul Silway

Have you ever asked yourself: “Where will I go when I die?” This is not a small question. It is the most important question of your life. Every human being will die one day, and after that, every person will live forever—either in Heaven or in Hell. These are the only two eternal destinations.

The Bible says in Hebrews 9:27: “It is appointed for people to die once, and after that comes judgment.”

This means we don’t get another chance after death. We don’t return as someone else. We don’t come back to try again. Once you die, your future is fixed. It cannot be changed by money, fame, power, education, or how fit or successful you were on earth. The decision about where you will go—Heaven or Hell—must be made now, while you are still alive.

Some people believe that their good deeds and bad deeds are weighed like on a scale. If the good is more, they think they will go to Heaven. But the Bible never teaches this. God is not sitting with a scale. He is not measuring your life like that. You can never know for sure where you’re heading if you think like this.

But the Bible tells us that you can be 100% sure about where you will go. You don’t have to wait until you die to find out. You can know right now.

In John 1:12, it says: “But to all who believed Him and accepted Him, He gave the right to become children of God.”

The moment you believe in Jesus and receive Him into your heart, you are saved. Your name is written in the Lamb's Book of Life in Heaven. You are born again—not physically, but spiritually. You become a child of God. You are not a servant trying to enter Heaven—you are a son or daughter of God. And Heaven becomes your eternal home.

If someone asks you, "Are you saved?" and you're unsure, confused, or say "I don't know"—that usually means you are not saved yet. This is not something you should leave for later. It's not something to think about when you're older. You must make this decision while you are alive.

Don't postpone it.

Your funeral cannot save you. Important people attending your funeral won't save you. Your church, your parents, your friends, your titles, or your background can't save you. No one else can make this decision for you. Even God won't force you to believe. He gave every person a free will to choose.

He has already done everything needed for your salvation. Jesus died on the cross and rose again for the sins of every human being. Every sin—past, present, and future—has been paid for. Now the decision is in your hands.

You must hear this Good News, believe it, and receive Jesus into your heart.

In Romans 10:9, it says: "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

Don't wait. Death does not send an email or phone call. It can come when you least expect it—even in your sleep. And when you die, you will immediately wake up in either Heaven or Hell. There is no wandering of souls, no second birth, no reincarnation, and no other path.

This is your moment. You don't have to be afraid. The invitation to Heaven is open for you right now. If you are ready, you can pray the prayer below with all your heart—and your life will be changed forever.

Dear God,

I believe that You love me.

I believe that Jesus died on the cross for my sins and rose again to give me eternal life.

I know that I cannot save myself.

Right now, I choose to believe in You.

I open my heart and receive Jesus as my Lord and Savior.

ONLY TWO ETERNAL DESTINATIONS – CHOOSE WISELY – PASTOR PAUL Silway

1. YOU LIVE ONCE, YOU DIE ONCE

Many believe in reincarnation or think they'll get another chance after death, but the Bible says otherwise. Hebrews 9:27 tells us, "It is appointed for men to die once, and after this the judgment." This life is the only chance to make your eternal decision.

2. THERE ARE ONLY TWO ETERNAL DESTINATIONS

According to God's Word and heavenly revelations, there are only two places your soul can go after death—Heaven or Hell. There is no third option, no in-between, and no return.

3. HEAVEN IS A REAL PLACE OF JOY

Heaven is full of peace, beauty, love, and the presence of God. There is no pain, no sorrow, no death—only everlasting joy for those who believe in Jesus Christ and have their names written in the Book of Life.

4. HELL IS ALSO REAL—AND IT'S FOREVER

Hell is a place of darkness, suffering, and total separation from God. It was made for the devil and his demons, but those who reject God's gift of salvation during life will also go there after death.

5. YOUR CHOICE DETERMINES YOUR DESTINATION

God never sends anyone to Hell—people choose it by rejecting Him. Once a person dies, they can't change their decision. That's why the choice must be made while you are alive.

6. BEING "GOOD" IS NOT ENOUGH

Many think doing good deeds is enough to reach Heaven. But Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." Only faith in Jesus brings salvation.

7. THERE IS NO PURGATORY

The Bible does not mention purgatory. Jesus paid the full price for your sins on the cross. Colossians 2:13 says, "God forgave us all our sins." There is no more payment needed after death. Salvation is complete in Christ alone.

8. HEAVEN IS MORE WONDERFUL THAN WE CAN IMAGINE

Those who have seen Heaven say it is filled with music, celebration, family, and things far more beautiful than anything on earth. It is the true home for all who belong to God.

9. HELL IS FILLED WITH REGRET

In Hell, people remember every chance they had to follow God. They live with the regret of rejecting truth. There is no escape, no relief, and no comfort—only eternal sorrow.

10. NOW IS THE TIME TO CHOOSE

2 Peter 3:9 says, "The Lord is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." God offers Heaven freely to all who believe in His Son. The decision must be made before death—because eternity cannot be changed afterward.

CONCLUSION:

Heaven and Hell are real. If you miss Heaven, you won't miss Hell. Don't wait. Choose Jesus today—because forever is waiting.

CHEER UP – JESUS HAS ALREADY OVERCOME THE WORLD FOR YOU

1. In this world you will have troubles. But Jesus said, “Be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.” (John 16:33) You are not a loser—you are already a winner!
2. If you belong to Jesus, you don’t have to live in fear. He already defeated the darkness of this world for you.
3. Jesus was not defeated on the cross—He won! He broke the power of sin, fear, and death forever.
4. His victory is your victory. You are not helpless. You are a child of God, full of His power.
5. 1 John 5:4 says your faith gives you victory over the world.
6. But faith only works when you use it. Speak it. Act on it. Show that you believe.
7. The blind man in Mark 10 had to speak his faith before he was healed. So must you.
8. Don’t cry and complain—speak what you believe. Say what God says.
9. Even a little faith can move mountains. (Matthew 17:20) You already have faith inside you. (Romans 12:3)
10. Pray with faith, not fear. Rejoice even before the answer comes!
11. The enemy wants to bring fear and worry. Don’t accept it. Say, “I am victorious in Jesus!”
12. Romans 8:37 says, “We are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.”
13. Jesus took back all authority and gave it to you. (Matthew 28:18)
14. You are seated with Christ in heavenly places. You are above your problems!
15. 1 John 4:4 says, “Greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world.”
16. You are not fighting to win. You are standing in a victory already won by Jesus.
17. 2 Corinthians 2:14 says God always causes you to triumph in Christ.
18. Don’t live as a victim. You are a victor in Christ—strong, bold, and blessed.
19. Nothing can separate you from God’s love. (Romans 8:35–37)
20. You are more than a conqueror. Jesus won the battle, and you share in that victory.
21. The light of Jesus shines in you. You are part of His winning team!
22. James 1:2 says to count it joy when you face trials. They bring promotion and victory.

23. Romans 8:28 says all things—even bad ones—will work for your good.
24. If this year was hard, don't give up. Big battles bring big victories.
25. Every problem was a chance for God to show His power in your life.
26. Like a pilot says during turbulence, “All is under control”—Jesus says the same to you.
27. Jesus wants you to live with peace and joy. You are on the winning side!
28. 1 Timothy 6:12 says, “Fight the good fight of faith.” Don't let the enemy steal your joy or calling.
29. Live the life God planned for you—full of strength, peace, and victory.
30. Revelation 17:14 says Jesus wins, and you win with Him because you are His.
31. Remind yourself every day: “Jesus has overcome for me!”
32. So cheer up! You are victorious in Jesus. Your future is bright, and your victory is sure!

GOD GIVES SPECIAL CARE TO CHILDREN – PASTOR PAUL SILWAY

1. CHILDREN ARE PRECIOUS TO GOD

Jesus said, “Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children.” — Matthew 19:14

Children are very important to God. They are not a distraction; they are a delight to Him. Even when Jesus was busy healing and teaching, He stopped everything to welcome the children. That shows how valuable they are in His eyes. He didn't say they might be part of His kingdom—He said they already belong! This means that children carry a special place in God's heart from the beginning of their lives.

2. GOD SHOWS COMPASSION WHERE IT'S MOST NEEDED

“The Lord is close to the brokenhearted; He rescues those whose spirits are crushed.” — Psalm 34:18 God is fair and kind to everyone, but He pays extra attention to those who are ignored, mistreated, or vulnerable. Since many people in the world do not treat children with respect or care, God steps in with greater compassion. He watches over them personally, because He knows they cannot defend themselves. His love moves quickly toward those who are weak or overlooked, like children.

3. GOD'S PLAN IS THAT PARENTS TEACH THEIR CHILDREN

“Repeat them again and again to your children. Talk about them when you are at home...” — Deuteronomy 6:7

One of the first instructions God gave to families was to teach children His Word at home. This means that the spiritual training of a child is not the church's job first—it is the parents' job. Sadly, many parents are too distracted or unaware. That's why God, in His mercy, gives extra care to children—to make sure they still have a chance to know Him.

4. CHILDREN MUST BE READY FOR THE ‘AGE OF CHOOSING’

“Choose today whom you will serve... But as for me and my family, we will serve the Lord.” — Joshua 24:15

God wants children to be ready to make the right choice when they are old enough to understand right and wrong. This is called the “Age of Choosing.” Until then, they are innocent. If children are not taught properly before that age, they might grow up confused or distant from God. So God watches over them carefully and works to give them every chance to know Him personally.

5. SOME ADULTS ARE A BAD EXAMPLE TO CHILDREN

“But if you cause one of these little ones... to fall into sin, it would be better for you to be thrown into the sea...” — Mark 9:42

Some adults live in ways that hurt children’s faith. Their words, actions, or example push kids away from God. Jesus gave a very serious warning to such people. He said it is a terrible thing to lead children into sin. That’s why God has to step in with love and protection—to undo the damage caused by careless adults.

6. GOD HATES ABORTION BECAUSE IT IGNORES THE CHILD’S VALUE

“You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother’s womb.” — Psalm 139:13

Every child is created by God with care and purpose. Life begins in the womb, and God knows every baby even before they are born. But when adults choose abortion, they act as if their plans are more important than the child’s life. God is deeply grieved by this and shows extra love and care to children who are not given a chance to live.

7. FATHERS ARE MEANT TO REFLECT GOD’S LOVE

“We respected our earthly fathers who disciplined us... shouldn’t we submit even more to the discipline of the Father of our spirits?” — Hebrews 12:9

God planned for fathers to show love, kindness, and guidance to their children. But many children grow up without good fathers. Some are absent; some are unkind. Because of this brokenness, God gives extra love and attention to children so they can still know what a true Father’s heart is like.

8. CHILDREN ARE INNOCENT UNTIL THEY KNOW RIGHT FROM WRONG

“And they will not be punished for their parents’ sins. Righteous people will be rewarded... and wicked people will be punished...” — Ezekiel 18:20

Children may have a sin nature inside, but they are not guilty until they grow old enough to make their own choices. A crying baby is not sinful—he or she is just learning to express needs and emotions. Calling children “bad” or “evil” is wrong. God sees their innocence and gives them special protection until they are old enough to choose for themselves.

9. GOD WANTS FAMILIES TO WORSHIP TOGETHER

“I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the Lord.’” — Psalm 122:1

God’s house is for everyone—adults and children alike. Even though some people think children should be silent or sent away, God loves when families worship together. He doesn’t mind the sound of babies or little ones. In fact, their praise is powerful to Him.

10. GOD SEES CHILDREN AS PART OF HIS KINGDOM

“I tell you the truth, unless you turn from your sins and become like little children, you will never get into the Kingdom of Heaven.” — Matthew 18:3

Jesus didn’t just welcome children—He told adults to learn from them! Children’s trust, honesty, and simple faith are what God desires. He wants His Kingdom to be filled with people who have a childlike heart. That’s why children are not only welcome in the Kingdom—they are examples of it!

11. CHILDREN ARE A BLESSING, NOT A BURDEN

“Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a reward from him.” — Psalm 127:3

Some people see children as a problem or an interruption to their plans. But God sees them as precious gifts. Every child is a reward from Him, not a mistake or a burden. That’s why He gives them His attention and care, even when the world doesn’t.

12. JESUS TOOK TIME TO BLESS THE CHILDREN

“Then he put his hands on their heads and blessed them before he left.” — Matthew 19:15

Even though Jesus was busy healing and teaching, He didn’t ignore the children. He laid His hands on them and spoke blessings over them. This shows us how we should also value and speak life into every child, no matter how young or small they are.

13. GOD DOES NOT RANK ADULTS HIGHER THAN CHILDREN

“For God does not show favoritism.” — Romans 2:11

God does not see adults as more important than children. People often think only grown-ups matter or deserve to be heard. But God treats everyone equally, no matter their age. He listens to children and cares about their lives, thoughts, and feelings.

14. CHILDREN WERE COUNTED AMONG THE 5,000 FED

“About 5,000 men were fed that day, in addition to all the women and children!” — Matthew 14:21

When Jesus performed the miracle of feeding the multitudes, the Bible clearly includes women and children. That’s because they mattered to God. Even though the culture focused on counting men, God made sure to mention that the children were part of the blessing.

15. THE HOLY SPIRIT WORKS THROUGH CHILDREN TOO

“I will pour out my Spirit even on servants—men and women alike—and they will prophesy.” — Joel 2:29

God does not wait until someone is an adult to fill them with His Spirit. He can use children to speak His words, sing, pray, and even bring comfort to others. Their spirits are alive to God, and He enjoys working through their pure hearts.

16. CHILDREN ARE A LINK TO THE NEXT GENERATION

“This promise is to you, and to your children, and even to the Gentiles—all who have been called by the Lord our God.” — Acts 2:39

God’s plan is that faith is passed from parents to children, and then from those children to their children. Children are not just the future—they are the carriers of the gospel to the next generation. That’s why God guards and watches over them closely.

17. GOD DEFENDS THE HELPLESS

“He ensures that orphans and widows receive justice.” — Deuteronomy 10:18

God stands up for those who cannot defend themselves, and that includes children. When others ignore, hurt, or reject them, God becomes their protector. He sees every injustice done to a child and promises to defend them and bring justice.

18. CHILDREN HAVE ANGELS WATCHING OVER THEM

“Their angels are always in the presence of my heavenly Father.” — Matthew 18:10

God assigns angels to watch over children. These angels are constantly before His throne, ready to carry out His commands. That shows how seriously God takes the care of children. He does not leave them alone—He surrounds them with heavenly help.

19. GOD HEARS THE PRAISE OF CHILDREN

“You have taught children and infants to tell of your strength.” — Psalm 8:2

Children’s worship and prayers matter to God. He even uses their praise to silence the enemy! That means when children sing to God or say simple prayers, it is powerful and real in heaven. Their voices carry spiritual strength.

20. JESUS IDENTIFIES WITH CHILDREN

“Anyone who welcomes a little child like this on my behalf is welcoming me.” — Matthew 18:5

Jesus said that when we welcome and care for a child, it’s the same as welcoming Him. That means every time we help, love, or respect a child, we are honoring Jesus Himself. That’s why God watches closely how we treat the children around us.

21. THE KINGDOM OF GOD BELONGS TO CHILDLIKE HEARTS

“The Kingdom of God belongs to those who are like these children.” — Luke 18:16

Childlike trust, innocence, and humility are the qualities that God loves. Adults often grow proud or self-sufficient, but children depend on others. That’s why God wants everyone to become like a child in their hearts—to trust Him fully and love Him simply.

22. GOD’S LOVE CORRECTS THE WRONG VIEW OF CHILDREN

“Do not think you are better than you really are.” — Romans 12:3

Many people think children are too young to be important. But God corrects this wrong thinking. He wants us to honor children, listen to them, and teach them with love. His view is different from the world. He lifts up the humble—including little ones.

23. GOD IS RAISING UP A GENERATION OF RIGHTEOUS CHILDREN

“All your children will be taught by the Lord, and they will have great peace.” — Isaiah 54:13

God is preparing children to be strong in faith. He wants to teach them directly through His Spirit and Word. When children are taught by the Lord, they grow up with peace and purpose. They will be bold, loving, and used by God in mighty ways.

1. WHY DID JESUS CHOOSE BREAD AND WINE FOR THE LORD'S SUPPER?

Jesus used bread to symbolize His body broken for us and wine to represent His blood shed for our forgiveness. These simple elements remind us physically of His spiritual sacrifice and love.

Scripture: Matthew 26:26–28; Luke 22:19–20

2. CAN WE TAKE THE LORD'S SUPPER IF WE ARE DOUBTING OR STRUGGLING WITH FAITH?

Yes. Doubt is natural, and the Lord's Supper can strengthen faith as you remember Christ's love. Come with a sincere heart and ask God to increase your faith.

Scripture: Mark 9:24; Hebrews 11:1

3. IS THE LORD'S SUPPER THE SAME AS BAPTISM?

No. Baptism symbolizes becoming born again and joining God's family. The Lord's Supper is a regular act to remember Jesus' sacrifice and renew faith.

Scripture: Romans 6:4; 1 Corinthians 11:26

4. WHAT IF I ACCIDENTALLY TAKE THE LORD'S SUPPER UNWORTHILY?

If you realize this afterward, repent sincerely and ask for forgiveness. God is merciful and restores those who confess their sins. Use this as a reminder to examine your heart carefully next time.

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 11:27–29; 1 John 1:9

5. WHY DO SOME CHURCHES USE GRAPE JUICE INSTEAD OF WINE?

Some use grape juice to avoid alcohol issues. The important thing is the meaning—the blood of Jesus—not the drink itself. Unfermented juice is acceptable.

Scripture: Ephesians 5:18

6. CAN THE LORD'S SUPPER BRING PHYSICAL HEALING?

While it is primarily spiritual, taking communion with faith can bring peace and healing. Jesus bore our sickness and suffering, and remembering Him strengthens our healing faith.

Scripture: Isaiah 53:5; James 5:14–16

7. SHOULD WE FAST OR PREPARE SPECIALLY BEFORE TAKING COMMUNION?

Some choose to fast or pray to prepare their hearts. The key is sincere repentance and faith. God values your heart attitude above rituals.

Scripture: Psalm 51:10–12; Joel 2:12–13

8. WHAT IF SOMEONE FEELS UNWORTHY TO TAKE THE LORD'S SUPPER?

Feeling unworthy is normal. The Lord's Supper is a gift of grace for broken hearts.

Confess your sins, believe in God's forgiveness, and receive His grace through communion.

Scripture: Matthew 11:28–30; 1 John 1:9

9. CAN THE LORD'S SUPPER BE TAKEN PRIVATELY OR ONLY IN CHURCH?

While best celebrated with the church family, communion can be taken privately when necessary. What matters most is remembering Jesus with faith.

Scripture: Matthew 18:20

10. HOW SHOULD NEW BELIEVERS UNDERSTAND THE LORD'S SUPPER?

It is a sacred meal to remember Jesus' sacrifice, celebrate His love, and renew faith. Encourage respect, humility, and understanding in new believers.

Scripture: Luke 22:19–20; Acts 2:42

11. WHAT IF A CHURCH DOESN'T OBSERVE THE LORD'S SUPPER REGULARLY?

Regular communion strengthens faith and unity. The Bible encourages believers to observe it often. Neglecting it can weaken spiritual life.

Scripture: Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 11:26

12. WHY IS SELF-EXAMINATION IMPORTANT BEFORE TAKING COMMUNION?

Self-examination helps us confess sins and come clean before God, ensuring we don't take communion lightly or in an unrepentant state.

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 11:28–29; Psalm 139:23–24

PLEASE DON'T KEEP THIS TO YOURSELF — SHARE IT WITH OTHER BELIEVERS.

The Bible says:

"There is one who scatters, yet increases more; And there is one who withholds more than is right, But it leads to poverty." — Proverbs 11:24

Don't hold back the Word of Truth. Only God's truth has the power to set people free.

Lies bind—but truth sets free. Satan, our enemy, bombards the world with lies. But we are children of light and truth. Let us boldly speak the truth and bombard the darkness with it.

It's a battle between lies from hell and truth from heaven. Hell binds—but Heaven sets people free. Let's keep spreading the light.

Title: ONLY ONE ENEMY – THE TRUTH ABOUT SPIRITUAL WARFARE by Pastor Paul Silway

1. Christians have only one real enemy, and it's not people. The devil wants us to believe that humans are our enemies, but this is a lie from Satan and his demons. The Bible tells us that our fight is not against people but against evil spiritual forces.

2. When someone thinks another person is their enemy, that thought is not from God—it is planted by the devil. He wants us to hate, fight, and hurt one another. But this is not the way of God. God's truth shows us a better way.

3. That's why Christians do not use stones, sticks, swords, guns, angry words, or violence to fight. These are weapons of the world and of hell. God has given us heavenly weapons that are very different and powerful.

4. Our weapons are love, peace, forgiveness, kindness, prayer, and truth. These are not weak weapons—these are weapons from Heaven. The Bible says, "Love your enemies" and "Pray for those who persecute you." These are our real weapons.

5. When we are hurt or hated, we don't take revenge. We don't curse or attack. Instead, we forgive and pray. That's how we defeat darkness—with the light of God's love. Hate cannot destroy hate—only love can do that.

6. As Christians, even our prayers are different. We don't pray to curse anyone. We never ask God to harm people. We pray the language of blessing, not cursing. Why? Because Jesus has already taken every curse upon Himself on the cross. He paid the full price for our sins and removed every curse.

7. That's why a true Christian cannot curse anyone. We don't have curses to give—we only have blessings. God not only blessed us, but He made us a blessing to others. This is His heart. We speak life, peace, and goodness over others, not destruction.

8. In some places, people go to godmen or babas, and when someone complains about a person, the godman may speak a curse or do something to harm that person. But that is not the Christian way. We do not repay evil with evil—we overcome evil with good.

9. The Bible also teaches that a murderer cannot go to Heaven. This means anyone who kills—directly or indirectly—is guilty. Whether you did it yourself, paid someone, supported it, gave approval, or caused fear that led to it—it is still murder.

10. It doesn't matter if it's done in the name of religion, god, revenge, politics, fear, or justice—murder is still murder. God clearly said, "Do not kill." This command has no excuse or exception.

11. Each person shows who their god is by how they behave. If someone uses hate, violence, and murder, they are not serving the God of Heaven—they are showing the works of darkness. Others who walk in love, peace, and forgiveness are revealing the true God.

12. Every action is like an advertisement. One is advertising Heaven, and the other is advertising Hell. After death, each one will go to the place they lived for—either Heaven or Hell. These are the only two eternal places.

13. There is only one life, one death, and then judgment. The Bible does not teach many births or reincarnation. There is no second chance after death. That's why we must choose the truth now while we are alive.

14. God loves everyone deeply. He doesn't want anyone to perish or be separated from Him forever. That's why He sent the truth—to save us, to guide us, and to lead us to Heaven.

15. If anyone dies rejecting the truth, they will not get another chance after death. The time to accept the truth is now. There is still time to turn from hate, violence, and lies—and turn to love, peace, and God's way.

16. This message is not to judge anyone, but to open your eyes before it's too late. Don't be fooled by violence that claims to be from God. True love, peace, and forgiveness come only from the God of Heaven.

TITLE: THE TRUTH ABOUT CONVERSION – Pastor Paul Silway

1. GOD NEVER FORCES ANYONE TO BELIEVE

God has given every human a free will. He does not force anyone to receive Him, follow Him, or worship Him. He waits for people to open their hearts willingly. If a person is forced, it is not true conversion. God does not use manipulation—that is the devil's method. We must only share the truth and leave the decision to the hearer. (Revelation 3:20)

2. GOD LOVES EVEN THOSE WHO REJECT HIM

When someone rejects Jesus or even tears the Bible, God does not hate them. He is grieved because He loves them unconditionally. His desire is that they come to repentance, not destruction. (2 Peter 3:9)

3. LOVE OR HATE—WHICH GOD DO YOU SERVE?

There are only two sources—God of love or god of hate. If a person serves the true God, the fruit will be love, forgiveness, and peace. But if someone serves the enemy, the fruit will be hate, violence, and destruction. (Matthew 7:20)

4. ALL PEOPLE ARE CREATED IN GOD'S IMAGE

God made every person in His image. He loves everyone equally. People choose whom they will follow. But only those who receive Christ will carry His love and character. (Genesis 1:27)

5. CHRISTIANITY IS NOT A RELIGION

Christianity is not about changing religions. It is a relationship with Jesus. It is receiving forgiveness through the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. This brings eternal life, not just religious practice. (John 17:3)

6. TRUE FAITH IS NEVER FORCED

Christian faith cannot be forced. It must come from the heart. Evangelism means to share, not to pressure. If someone is forced, it is not a real change of heart. (John 1:12)

7. REAL CHANGE HAPPENS INSIDE FIRST

Conversion does not mean changing how we dress or look. It starts with a new heart. God changes us from the inside, and the change will be seen on the outside naturally. (Ezekiel 36:26)

8. CHRISTIANITY IS A HEART MATTER

True Christianity is not about rituals or traditions. It is about the heart being changed by God. Without heart change, no external act matters. (Romans 2:29)

9. TRUE FOLLOWERS DO NOT FORCE OTHERS

True Christians do not force anyone to believe. They simply share God's love and truth. Even good deeds and charity cannot force a true conversion. (2 Corinthians 5:20)

10. ONLY GOD CAN CONVERT

Man cannot change another's heart. Only God can do that through His Spirit. When someone freely opens their heart, the Spirit comes in and gives new life. (John 3:5–6)

11. CONVERSION IS A MIRACLE FROM GOD

When someone truly receives Christ, it is the greatest miracle. The person becomes a new creation and begins to reflect God's love. (2 Corinthians 5:17)

12. FRUIT SHOWS TRUE CONVERSION

You can recognize a true believer by their fruit. A person with a new heart will not hate, lie, or force others. They will live a life of love, forgiveness, and peace. (Galatians 5:22–23)

13. GOD LOVES EVEN THE WORST SINNER

Even those who once hated Jesus can be saved. If they repent and open their heart, God forgives and uses them for His glory. (1 Timothy 1:15–16)

14. PERSECUTORS CAN BECOME PREACHERS

Many who once persecuted Christians later became faithful believers. When they truly receive Jesus, they no longer hate but love others, even their enemies. (Acts 9:1–6)

15. NO HATE IN HEAVEN, NO LOVE IN HELL

Heaven is full of God's love. Hell is full of hate. People will spend eternity with the one they served on earth. Those who choose love will be with God. (1 John 4:8)

16. A TRUE CHRISTIAN LOVES OTHERS

If someone truly follows God, they will love even those who disagree with them. They will not harm others, because the Spirit of God lives in them. (1 John 3:14)

17. THE DEVIL ATTACKS TRUE BELIEVERS

Once someone is truly born again, the enemy often attacks them more. He wants to destroy their testimony. But God gives strength to overcome. (1 Peter 5:8–10)

18. TRUE VS. FALSE CONVERSION

True conversion is when the Holy Spirit enters a willing heart. False conversion is when someone pretends or is forced—God does not enter such hearts. (Matthew 7:21–23)

19. A TRUE CONVERT OBEYS GOD'S WORD

Real believers love and obey God's Word. It shows them how to live, grow, and serve. They are led by God's Spirit, not rituals. (James 1:22–25)

20. ONLY GOD CAN SEE THE HEART

God knows whether someone has truly believed or just acted outwardly. He sees the heart and only accepts genuine repentance. (1 Samuel 16:7)

21. THE WORD MUST BE PREACHED

God uses people to preach the Word, but salvation belongs to Him. Preachers only share. The Spirit does the saving work in a person's heart. (Romans 10:14)

22. JESUS DIED FOR THE WHOLE WORLD

Jesus did not die only for one group. He gave His life for all people. Anyone who believes in Him can be saved—regardless of background. (1 John 2:2)

23. PREACHING IS LOVE, NOT FORCE

Sharing the good news is an act of love. It is not forcing anyone to change. It is offering the gift of eternal life through Jesus to a broken world. (Mark 16:15)

THE POWER OF JESUS' BLOOD – 10 LIFE-CHANGING TRUTHS - Pastor Paul Silway

1. ONLY JESUS' BLOOD CAN FORGIVE SINS

No other blood—not animals or humans—can take away sin. Only Jesus, the sinless Son of God, could shed perfect blood to cleanse us forever. (Hebrews 9:22)

2. HIS BLOOD PAID THE PRICE FOR YOUR FREEDOM

We were trapped in sin, but Jesus gave His life to buy us back. You are valuable—His blood shows how much you're worth. (1 Corinthians 6:20)

3. YOU ARE MADE CLEAN AND NEW

No matter how dirty your past, His blood washes you white as snow. You are forgiven, made new, and accepted by God. (1 John 1:9)

4. HIS BLOOD BRINGS YOU CLOSE TO GOD

Sin once separated us from God. Now, through the blood of Jesus, we can walk boldly into His presence and enjoy a close relationship. (Ephesians 2:13)

5. THE BLOOD GIVES YOU VICTORY OVER THE DEVIL

The enemy can no longer accuse you. The blood of Jesus is your defense, your power, and your victory. (Revelation 12:11)

6. YOU ARE PROTECTED BY HIS BLOOD

Just like the Israelites were protected in Egypt, the blood of Jesus covers you and keeps you safe from evil. (Exodus 12:13)

7. IT BREAKS SIN'S POWER OVER YOU

You're no longer a slave to sin. His blood breaks every chain and gives you the power to live free. (Revelation 1:5)

8. YOU NOW BELONG TO GOD'S FAMILY

The blood of Jesus has made you part of God's household. You are loved, chosen, and never alone. (Ephesians 2:19)

9. THERE IS NO MORE SHAME OR GUILT

You don't have to carry the past anymore. His blood has wiped it clean. You can live with peace and joy. (Hebrews 10:22)

10. HIS BLOOD HAS OPENED THE DOOR TO HEAVEN

When you believe in Jesus, His blood gives you access to eternal life. You are ready for Heaven, welcomed and loved. (Hebrews 9:12)

STAND UNITED IN LOVE – A CALL TO ALL CHRISTIANS – Pastor Paul Silway

(Persecution increases church growth – this is the wisdom of God)

1. SET ASIDE DOCTRINAL DIFFERENCES AND STAND TOGETHER

This is not the time to let minor doctrinal issues divide us. The spiritual Enemy (Satan and Demons) wants to weaken the Church by focusing us on what separates us, not what unites us. Let every Christian from every denomination remember that we serve the same Lord and are part of the same body. Let love be our bond, not debate. Let truth and humility guide us.

"Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds us all together in perfect harmony." (Colossians 3:13–14)

2. THE FIVE-FOLD MINISTRY MUST LEAD IN UNITY

Apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers—this is your moment to rise together. The Church follows your example. Lay aside competition and self-promotion. Come together in prayer, fasting, and unity. The Lord is calling His leaders to be one voice of truth, love, and power.

"Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers... This will continue until we all come to such unity in our faith..." (Ephesians 4:11,13)

3. WARN THE BODY OF CHRIST: DIVISION EMPOWERS THE ENEMY

Division gives strength to our spiritual enemy, Satan, and weakens the Church. When we fight each other, we stop fighting darkness. Persecution increases when the Church is divided. Unity brings power, and prayer in agreement moves Heaven.

"If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand." (Mark 3:25)

4. CALL THE CHURCH TO DAILY PRAYER FOR ONE ANOTHER

Every pastor, every leader, every believer must ask their congregation to pray daily—not just for themselves but for Christians everywhere facing persecution. Let prayer arise from every home, every church, and every heart.

"Never stop praying. Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:17–18)

5. TEACH THE CHURCH THAT LOVE COMES FROM HEAVEN AND HATE FROM HELL

Love is the language of Heaven. It brings peace, mercy, joy, unity, harmony, and forgiveness. Hate is the language of Hell. It produces violence, insults, destruction, and death. Let every believer choose which kingdom they represent—Heaven or Hell.

"Dear children, let's not merely say that we love each other; let us show the truth by our actions." (1 John 3:18)

6. ENCOURAGE BELIEVERS TO BE AGENTS OF LOVE, NOT HATE

Anyone who walks in love reflects God. Anyone who spreads hate gives room to our spiritual enemy. Ask your people—who is working through you? The Spirit of God or the spirit of hate? Let our words, actions, and thoughts reflect the love and light of Christ.

"We love each other because he loved us first. If someone says, 'I love God,' but hates a fellow believer, that person is a liar." (1 John 4:19–20)

7. STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH TO STAND STRONG TOGETHER

Remind the Church that now is not the time to fall apart but to stand strong. Encourage them to forgive one another, support each other, and speak life into the Body. The world will know we are Christ's disciples by our love and unity.

"Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." (John 13:35)

8. REMEMBER: WE HAVE NO HUMAN ENEMIES

We must never forget that our enemies are not people—they are Satan and his demons. The world may think Christians see them as enemies, but we do not. We love them and pray for their salvation and blessing. We use spiritual weapons—not sticks, stones, swords, or guns. Our weapons are prayer, the

Word of God, and love. Jesus said, “Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you.” Christians are different—we fight spiritually and we bless, not curse.

“For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places.” (Ephesians 6:12)

We thank You for making us one Body in Christ. Today, we choose to set aside every division and walk in love and unity. Strengthen all leaders and members of Your Church to stand together in truth, peace, and power. Let Your Spirit lead us to forgive quickly, love deeply, and pray faithfully for one another. HEALING COMES BY FAITH, NOT BY TESTING JESUS – Pastor Paul Silway

(Don’t Challenge God—Believe and Receive)

1. TESTING JESUS BLOCKS HEALING

Some people say, “If Jesus can heal me, then I’ll believe in Him.” That’s not faith—that’s testing God. The Bible clearly says not to test the Lord. Jesus doesn’t respond to demands or prideful challenges. He responds to humble hearts full of faith. God is not trying to impress anyone—He’s trying to save and heal those who believe.

Matthew 4:7 – “Do not put the Lord your God to the test.”

2. FAITH IS THE KEY TO HEALING

Healing is not received by shouting or proving a point. Healing is received through faith in Jesus. If you don’t believe, you can’t receive. Faith opens the door to Heaven’s power. Doubt keeps the door locked. You must believe in your heart that Jesus is your healer. That’s when miracles happen.

Hebrews 11:6 – “Without faith it is impossible to please God.”

3. HEALING COMES AFTER HEARING

Faith doesn’t come automatically—it comes by hearing the Word of God. When you listen to the truth about Jesus, your faith begins to grow. Then you can use that faith to trust Him for healing, salvation, and blessing. Without hearing the truth, you won’t believe. Without believing, you won’t be healed.

Romans 10:17 – “Faith comes by hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.”

4. TESTIMONIES ARE GIVEN TO HELP US BELIEVE

When someone shares how Jesus healed them, it’s not a story to be argued with. It’s a gift to build your faith. Testimonies are real-life proof that Jesus still heals. If you reject them, you reject a chance to receive. But if you believe, you can receive the same miracle.

Revelation 12:11 – “They overcame... by the word of their testimony.”

5. HEALING IS PART OF SALVATION

Jesus didn’t come only to forgive sins—He came to heal the whole person. That includes your body, soul, and spirit. When you accept Jesus into your life, healing is part of what He offers. You don’t have to beg for healing—it’s already been paid for at the cross.

Isaiah 53:5 – “By His stripes, we are healed.”

6. DON'T BLOCK GOD WITH PRIDE OR ANGER

Some people miss their healing because their hearts are full of pride, anger, or doubt. These things block the flow of God's power. When your soul is filled with truth and humility, healing can come. Let go of resistance. Open your heart to Jesus.

3 John 1:2 – “I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers.”

7. JESUS HEALS TODAY—HE HASN'T CHANGED

Some say healing was only for Bible times. That is not true. Jesus has not changed. He still heals, saves, and delivers today—just like before. If He did it for others, He can do it for you. But you must believe.

Hebrews 13:8 – “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.”

8. MIRACLES ARE NOT FOR ARGUMENTS

God doesn't do miracles to win arguments. He does miracles to show love, mercy, and power to those who trust Him. If you come to Jesus just to test Him, you will miss the miracle. But if you come to Him with faith, your life can be changed forever.

Mark 16:17 – “These signs will follow those who believe.”

9. THE SPIRIT REALM IS REAL

Many heavenly revelations confirm that healing starts in the spirit first. In Heaven, everything is full of life. When your soul agrees with God's truth, your body can receive life and healing too. Healing flows from Heaven into Earth when you believe.

2 Corinthians 4:18 – “We fix our eyes... on what is unseen.”

10. BELIEVE FIRST—THEN SEE THE MIRACLE

Don't wait for proof before you believe. That's not how the Kingdom of God works. First, believe in Jesus. Then healing will follow. Don't say, “Show me, and I'll believe.” Instead, say, “I believe—and I will see.” That's real faith. That's when healing flows.

John 20:29 – “Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.”

FORGIVE WITHOUT LIMITS - Pastor Paul Silway

(Forgiveness Releases God's Healing and Power)

1. A REAL TESTIMONY OF HEALING THROUGH FORGIVENESS

There was a woman who was hurt very badly by someone close to her. She allowed bitterness to stay in her heart for many years. Slowly, that bitterness affected her soul and then her body. She became very sick and developed many health problems. She prayed for healing and others prayed for her too, but nothing changed. Her healing was blocked because of the unforgiveness in her heart.

Then one day, she heard a message on forgiveness preached by Pastor Paul Silway. Her heart was touched. She decided to forgive from her heart. The moment she truly forgave, her healing began. She felt strength and peace return. The power of God started flowing into her body because the door was now open.

Later, when she stood on stage to share her testimony, a demon suddenly began to manifest in her. That evil spirit hated that she had been healed and set free. But Pastor Paul Silway immediately commanded the demon to leave in Jesus' name, and it left with a scream. That woman was completely delivered, and the entire congregation witnessed the power of forgiveness.

Ephesians 4:32 – Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

2. FORGIVENESS IS A COMMAND, NOT AN OPTION

Jesus clearly taught that we must forgive as many times as needed. When Peter asked Jesus, “Should I forgive someone up to seven times?” Jesus said, “Not seven times, but seventy times seven.” This means we must forgive again and again without counting.

Forgiveness is not something we do once. It should become a regular part of our life. When we keep our hearts clean from bitterness, we stay in God’s peace and power.

Matthew 18:21–22 – How many times should I forgive my brother? Up to seventy times seven.

3. UNFORGIVENESS OPENS A DOOR TO THE ENEMY

When you hold on to offense, anger, or bitterness, you allow the devil to enter your soul. Unforgiveness is like an open door that invites darkness, pain, and confusion. But when you forgive, you close that door.

Many people suffer emotionally, mentally, and even physically because they are holding on to old hurts. Forgiveness protects your spirit and gives you freedom.

Ephesians 4:26–27 – Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry. Do not give the devil a foothold.

4. FORGIVENESS BREAKS THE PAST OFF YOUR LIFE

If you keep thinking about what people did to you in the past, it will stop you from moving forward. God wants you to let go of old pain so He can lead you into a new beginning.

Forgiveness is like breaking the chains of the past. It allows you to step into healing, peace, and the future that God has prepared for you.

Philippians 3:13–14 – Forgetting what is behind, I press on toward the goal that God has set before me.

5. FORGIVENESS OPENS THE DOOR TO BLESSING

Some people go to church, pray, and serve faithfully—but still feel stuck. Their prayers seem unanswered. One hidden reason could be unforgiveness in the heart. When your heart is clean, your life becomes like good soil where blessings can grow.

When you forgive, you invite God’s blessing, joy, and favor into your life.

Psalm 24:4–5 – The one with clean hands and a pure heart will receive blessing from the Lord.

6. FORGIVENESS RELEASES HEALING POWER

Many sicknesses are connected to inner wounds, stress, and bitterness. When you forgive others, you are not only setting them free—you are also setting yourself free. Forgiveness brings healing to your soul and can even release physical healing in your body.

Forgiveness removes the poison of pain and replaces it with God’s peace.

James 5:16 – Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed.

7. FORGIVE BECAUSE CHRIST FORGAVE YOU

We don’t forgive people because they deserve it. We forgive because Jesus forgave us, even when we didn’t deserve it. He gave us mercy, and now we must do the same for others.

Forgiveness is an act of obedience to God. It’s not about feelings—it’s about honoring Him by following His example.

Colossians 3:13 – Forgive others as the Lord forgave you.

8. FORGIVENESS BRINGS PEACE AND JOY

Bitterness, anger, and hate can fill your heart with darkness. But when you forgive, peace enters your heart. Joy replaces sadness, and rest replaces stress. A clean heart is a peaceful heart.

Letting go of offenses allows you to live in the joy of the Lord every day.

Romans 14:17 – The Kingdom of God is righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit.

9. FORGIVENESS IS SPIRITUAL WARFARE

The devil uses unforgiveness to keep people in bondage. When you forgive, you take away his power. Forgiveness is a powerful spiritual weapon that brings victory and freedom.

Forgiving others is like breaking the chains that the enemy used to trap you.

2 Corinthians 2:10–11 – We must forgive, so that Satan does not outsmart us. We are not unaware of his plans.

10. TRUE LOVE ALWAYS FORGIVES

Love is not just about kind words or feelings. True love forgives. It does not keep a record of wrongs. If you want to walk in love, you must forgive.

When you choose love, you choose healing, freedom, and the presence of God.

1 Corinthians 13:5 – Love keeps no record of wrongs.

11. FORGIVENESS HELPS YOU MOVE FORWARD

God has a great plan for your life, but you must let go of the old to receive the new. If your hands are full of pain and offense, how will you receive God's promises?

Forgiveness clears your path and prepares your heart for blessings and new beginnings.

Isaiah 43:18–19 – Forget the former things; see, I am doing a new thing.

FINAL THOUGHT

Forgiveness is not weakness. It is strength. When you forgive, you become free. You make room for healing, joy, peace, and the power of God to flow in your life.

Don't let offense or bitterness block your healing and blessing. Choose to forgive today. Let the past go. God is ready to do something new in your life.

New Title: THE CROSS OPENED HEAVEN FOREVER – Pastor Paul Silway

1. THE CROSS CHANGED EVERYTHING

Jesus paid the full price for sin through the cross. Before, mankind was separated from God, but now the cross is the bridge. The veil in the temple was torn, showing Heaven is open to all believers. We don't earn Heaven; Jesus gave it.

Matthew 27:51 — "The veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom."

2. ACCESS TO THE FATHER IS NOW OPEN

Before Jesus, only priests could approach God. Now, every believer can enter His presence. God is near. Jesus is our only mediator.

Hebrews 10:19 — "Boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus."

3. JESUS TOOK OUR PLACE

Jesus, though innocent, bore our guilt. On the cross, justice and mercy met. We are now righteous in Christ.

Isaiah 53:5 — "He was wounded for our transgressions."

4. THE CROSS BROUGHT FORGIVENESS

Jesus became the final sacrifice for sin. Our sins are completely removed. We don't need to carry guilt. Ephesians 1:7 — "Redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins."

5. HEAVEN IS OUR HOME NOW

Believers are citizens of Heaven. We don't fear death. Jesus opened the door to eternal life. Philippians 3:20 — "Our conversation is in heaven."

6. A NEW CREATION IN CHRIST

Believers are made new. The past doesn't define us. We are free in Christ and part of God's family. 2 Corinthians 5:17 — "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature."

7. SIN HAS LOST ITS POWER

Jesus broke sin's control over us. We are no longer slaves to sin. The Holy Spirit helps us walk in freedom.

Romans 6:14 — "Sin shall not have dominion over you."

8. THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS GIVEN

After Jesus' resurrection, the Holy Spirit came. He now lives in every believer, guiding and empowering us.

John 14:16-17 — "He dwelleth with you, and shall be in you."

9. PEACE WITH GOD IS OURS

Jesus removed the wall of sin. We now have peace, even in trouble. We are children of God.

Romans 5:1 — "We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

10. GOD'S LOVE REVEALED IN THE CROSS

The cross shows God's love. He loved us first, before we changed. We are deeply valued.

Romans 5:8 — "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

11. LIVE IN THE POWER OF THE CROSS

The cross is a daily reality, not just a past event. Let it guide your life.

Galatians 2:20 — "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live."

12. HEAVEN IS FOREVER OPEN

The door to Heaven is open always. Anyone who believes can enter.

John 10:9 — "I am the door... if any man enter in, he shall be saved."

CLOSING THOUGHT

The cross changed everything. Through it, we receive forgiveness, love, peace, and purpose. Heaven is open forever. Believe and live in what Jesus has already done.

WHY SUNDAY GATHERING IS VERY IMPORTANT FOR BELIEVERS – Pastor Paul Silway

1. SUNDAY CELEBRATES JESUS' RESURRECTION

Sunday is special because it reminds us that Jesus rose from the dead on this day. The resurrection is the greatest event in history. It shows Jesus' victory over death and sin. When believers gather on Sunday, they celebrate this new life we have in Him. This gives us hope and joy every week. Scripture: "He is not here; he has risen!" (Luke 24:6)

2. SUNDAY GATHERING CONNECTS US TO RESURRECTION LIFE

By meeting on Sunday, we connect spiritually to the life Jesus won for us. Resurrection means new life, and gathering strengthens this truth in our hearts. We remember that because He lives, we too live. This connection encourages us to live victoriously.

Scripture: "Because I live, you also will live." (John 14:19)

3. SUNDAY IS A WEEKLY RENEWAL OF FAITH

Gathering on Sunday refreshes our faith and commitment to Jesus. It is a weekly chance to reset our focus on God's promises. We renew our hope and remember what Jesus did for us. This helps us face the week with strength and joy.

Scripture: "Let us encourage one another." (Hebrews 10:25)

4. SUNDAY GATHERING BUILDS CHURCH UNITY

When we come together on Sunday, we join as one Body of Christ. This builds unity and love among believers. We support and encourage one another in faith. Unity in the Church shows the world the power of the resurrection.

Our worship on Sunday honors Jesus' triumph over death. Singing, praying, and praising God remind us of His power. This worship uplifts our spirits and deepens our connection with Him. Worship is an act of celebrating the resurrection.

Scripture: "Praise the Lord, for he is good." (Psalm 106:1)

6. SUNDAY GATHERING STRENGTHENS OUR SPIRITUAL LIFE

Coming together helps believers grow spiritually. Teaching, fellowship, and prayer on Sunday strengthen our faith. We are encouraged to live out resurrection power daily. This spiritual strength is needed for life's challenges.

Scripture: "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord." (2 Peter 3:18)

7. SUNDAY GATHERING IS A PUBLIC TESTIMONY

Meeting on Sunday shows the world that we belong to Jesus. It is a public declaration of our faith in His resurrection. Our gathering tells others that death has been defeated. This boldness draws others to Christ.

Scripture: "You are the light of the world." (Matthew 5:14)

8. SUNDAY CELEBRATION KEEPS US FOCUSED ON ETERNAL LIFE

Sunday gatherings remind us that this life is temporary. Jesus' resurrection promises eternal life to all who believe. Meeting weekly keeps our eyes on heaven, not just the world. This hope changes how we live day by day.

Scripture: "We have a living hope through the resurrection." (1 Peter 1:3)

9. SUNDAY IS A DAY TO HEAR GOD'S WORD

Hearing God's Word on Sunday feeds our soul. The Bible reminds us of Jesus' resurrection and promises. Teaching builds faith and understanding. This knowledge helps us live as children of the resurrection.

Scripture: "Faith comes from hearing the message." (Romans 10:17)

10. SUNDAY GATHERING BUILDS FELLOWSHIP

Resurrection cannot be separated from Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Sunday gatherings help us remember both love and victory. This inspires us to love others deeply and serve faithfully.

Scripture: "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

15. SUNDAY GATHERING UNITES HEAVEN AND EARTH

When believers meet on Sunday, heaven touches earth. We experience God's presence and power. This supernatural connection fills us with peace and joy. It reminds us we belong to God's kingdom now.

Scripture: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." (Matthew 6:10)

16. SUNDAY GATHERING EMPOWERS US FOR SERVICE

Meeting together fills us with the strength and courage to serve others. Resurrection power equips us to share God's love. Sunday gatherings prepare us to be Christ's hands and feet in the world.

Scripture: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you." (Acts 1:8)

17. SUNDAY GATHERING INSPIRES JOY IN BELIEVERS

Remembering the resurrection brings deep joy. Sunday meetings lift our spirits even in hard times. This joy is a sign of God's presence with us. It encourages us to keep trusting Him.

Scripture: "Rejoice in the Lord always." (Philippians 4:4)

18. SUNDAY GATHERING HELPS US OVERCOME DEATH'S FEAR

The resurrection removes the fear of death. Sunday worship strengthens our confidence in eternal life. We learn to live without fear because Jesus conquered death. This gives us peace daily. Scripture: "The last enemy to be destroyed is death." (1 Corinthians 15:26)

19. SUNDAY GATHERING BUILDS DISCIPLESHIP

Regular Sunday meetings help us grow as disciples of Jesus. We learn to follow Him closely and obey His commands. Discipleship is easier with teaching and fellowship. This keeps us faithful.

Scripture: "Follow me," Jesus said. (John 21:22)

The early Church gathered on the first day of the week, setting a pattern for us. God's people continue this tradition to honor Jesus' resurrection. It is a joyful obedience that brings blessing.

Scripture: "On the first day of the week we came together." (Acts 20:7)

21. SUNDAY GATHERING HELPS US STAY ACCOUNTABLE

Meeting weekly keeps us accountable in our faith. We encourage each other to live rightly and serve well. Accountability strengthens the Church and protects us from falling away.

Scripture: "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other." (James 5:16)

22. SUNDAY GATHERING STRENGTHENS PRAYER LIFE

Gathering on Sunday encourages united prayer. Praying together increases faith and power. We intercede for one another and the world. This brings God's kingdom closer.

Scripture: "When two or three gather in my name, I am there." (Matthew 18:20)

23. SUNDAY GATHERING MAKES RESURRECTION REAL EVERY WEEK

Each Sunday gathering makes the resurrection real and present to us. It is not just a past event but a living reality in our lives. This weekly reminder fuels our faith and daily walk with Jesus.

Scripture: "Because Jesus lives, we also shall live." (John 11:25)

LOVE OR HATE – WHICH SPIRIT RULES YOU?

(A Message to the Persecuted and the Persecutors)

1. JESUS WAS PERSECUTED TOO

Christians are persecuted everywhere. But this is nothing new. Even Jesus was mocked, hated, and crucified. God understands the pain of the persecuted.

John 15:20 – "If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you."

2. GOD STANDS WITH THE PERSECUTED

God is not on the side of those who hate, attack, or hurt others. He stands with the brokenhearted and those treated unfairly.

Psalm 34:18 – "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

3. HATE BELONGS TO THE DEVIL

Satan can only use those who carry hate. He cannot use love. If you persecute others, your heart is filled with darkness.

1 John 3:15 – "Anyone who hates a brother or sister is a murderer."

4. LOVE COMES FROM GOD

The persecuted walk in love, and God is love. The persecutors walk in hate, and hate comes from hell. You show who you serve by your actions.

1 John 4:7–8 – "Love comes from God... Whoever does not love does not know God."

5. CHRISTIANS DON'T ATTACK OTHER FAITHS

No true Christian ever forces or attacks others for their beliefs. We believe love wins, not violence.

Romans 12:17–18 – "Do not repay evil for evil... If it is possible, live at peace with everyone."

6. FAITH IS A FREE CHOICE

Christianity never forces. God gives every person a free will. If someone walks away from faith, God still loves them.

Deuteronomy 30:19 – "Choose life... so that you and your children may live."

7. LOVE NEVER FORCES

It's a great insult to God to force people to follow Him. He is love, and love gives freedom.

1 Corinthians 13:4–5 – "Love is patient, love is kind... it does not demand its own way."

8. GOOD WORKS ARE NOT BRIBES

Some accuse Christians of bribing people through good deeds. But kindness is not a bribe—it's our command.

Matthew 5:16 – "Let your light shine... that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

9. WE ARE CALLED TO DO GOOD TO ALL

Christians love, serve, and help all people, no matter their religion. This shows the goodness of God.

Galatians 6:10 – "Do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

10. PEOPLE ARE DRAWN TO GOODNESS

If people come to God after seeing love, kindness, and care—how can that be wrong? Love attracts hearts.

Romans 2:4 – "God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance."

11. FEAR AND FORCE COME FROM DARKNESS

Any religion or leader who uses fear or violence is not led by God. God draws; Satan drives.

2 Timothy 1:7 – "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and a sound mind."

12. REAL CHANGE COMES FROM THE HEART

Only God can change hearts. We don't control others; we love them and let God work.

Ezekiel 36:26 – "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you."

13. HATE IS FROM HELL, LOVE IS FROM HEAVEN

If you walk in hate, Satan is using you. If you walk in love, God is using you.

James 3:14–15 – "If you harbor bitter envy... such 'wisdom' does not come from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic."

14. YOUR ACTIONS REVEAL WHO YOU SERVE

You either manifest love or hate. One leads to Heaven; the other leads to hell.

Matthew 7:20 – "By their fruits you will know them."

15. YOU ARE LOVED AND REMEMBERED BY GOD

If you are persecuted for doing good or loving Jesus—God will never forget you. He will reward you. Hebrews 6:10 – "God is not unjust; He will not forget your work and the love you have shown Him."

FINAL WORDS

You are special to God. He knows your pain. He sees your heart. The world may persecute, but God honors the faithful. Don't give up. Keep walking in love. Darkness will never win. Light will overcome.

DO ANGELS GET TIRED OR WEARY? Pastor Paul Silway

A Message of Truth and Thanksgiving

1. GOD CREATED ANGELS

HOLY SPIRIT: YOU started to believe that OUR FATHER created angels. This truth is written in the Bible.

SCRIPTURES:

Nehemiah 9:6 – "You alone are the Lord. You made the heavens, the heavens of heavens with all their host..."

Psalm 104:4 – "He makes His angels spirits; His ministers a flame of fire."

Psalm 148:1–5 – "Praise Him, all His angels... for He commanded, and they were created."

2. UNDERSTANDING THROUGH DANIEL'S STORY

ME: I began to understand this truth when YOU, HOLY SPIRIT, led ME to study Daniel 9:21 – "While I was speaking in prayer, the man Gabriel... being caused to fly swiftly, touched ME..."

Daniel was in prayer during captivity in Babylon. GOD sent Gabriel with the answer. But demonic resistance delayed Gabriel for 21 Earth days.

Daniel 10:12–13 says:

"From the first day that you set your heart to understand... your words were heard. But the prince of Persia resisted ME for 21 days. Then Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help ME."

3. "CAUSED TO FLY SWIFTLY" – WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

ME: YOU, HOLY SPIRIT, taught ME that "caused to fly swiftly" means Gabriel was weary from battle. He moved quickly, but needed refreshing. He was a light-being, but still needed to be strengthened again by the FATHER after fighting dark forces.

4. ANGELS NEED GOD'S STRENGTH TOO

HOLY SPIRIT: Gabriel is a spirit light being created by OUR FATHER. On this occasion, he needed refreshing. That means even angels can become weary and need their spirit light energy renewed by the CREATOR.

5. HUMANS ALSO NEED GOD'S ENERGY

ME: YOU reminded ME that I am also a spirit light being living in a physical body. I need spirit light energy from the FATHER just like angels do. OUR FATHER provides this spiritual energy. HE also provides physical strength through food and rest. GOD is the CREATOR of everything we need to live.

6. THE FATHER DESERVES THANKSGIVING

HOLY SPIRIT: Look at these verses that speak about worship and giving thanks because OUR FATHER is the CREATOR.

Revelation 4:11 – “You are worthy, O Lord... for You created all things.”

Revelation 11:17 – “We give thanks... because You have taken Your great power and reigned.”

These are words used by angels and saints in Heaven. Giving thanks means speaking words of appreciation to OUR FATHER for creating, providing, and sustaining us.

7. DAILY THANKSGIVING IS GOD'S PLAN

1 Chronicles 16:4 – Levites were assigned to give thanks and praise the LORD.

1 Chronicles 16:37 – They did this daily before the Ark.

HOLY SPIRIT: This shows how important giving thanks is to GOD. It should be part of your daily worship — at home, in church, and even before meals in public.

8. JESUS GAVE THANKS ON EARTH

Matthew 15:36 – JESUS gave thanks before multiplying the food.

Matthew 26:27 – JESUS gave thanks before giving the cup.

HOLY SPIRIT: CHRIST gave thanks often — not because HE needed spiritual refreshing like angels do, but to honor OUR FATHER as the PROVIDER of HIS physical body.

9. GIVE THANKS IN EVERYTHING

1 Thessalonians 5:18 – “In everything give thanks, for this is the will of GOD in CHRIST JESUS concerning you.”

HOLY SPIRIT: Even in hard times, keep thanking the FATHER. This proves that you believe HE is your CREATOR and that HE is good. Satan wants you to focus on the negative, but I am teaching you to always recognize the FATHER'S hand in your life.

FINAL THOUGHT

HOLY SPIRIT: Giving thanks is not just saying "thank you" — it is a way of life. Angels, saints, and even CHRIST gave thanks because OUR FATHER deserves it. HE created all, provides all, and sustains all. Let thankfulness rise from your heart every day.'

RESPECTING PRIVACY LIKE HEAVEN DOES – Pastor Paul Silway

1. ANGELS ARE FULL OF COMPASSION

Angels assigned to you are filled with God's compassion. When you face a trial, pain, or struggle, they feel God's love for you and respond quickly—but they never push or force. Their compassion is not emotional pity; it's divine care mixed with perfect wisdom. They move only by God's command and never act without purpose. They don't interfere unnecessarily and never speak down to you.

Scripture: Hebrews 1:14 — “Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?”

2. ANGELS NEVER INVADE YOUR PRIVACY

Even though angels know your thoughts, actions, and the details of your life, they never expose, mock, or shame you. They do not spread your struggles or failures. They see everything, yet they treat your life as sacred. In Heaven, privacy is honored because it reflects God's nature. Even your guardian angel will not repeat your private moments to others in Heaven. This teaches us to never misuse what we know about others.

Scripture: Romans 13:10 — “Love does no harm to a neighbor.”

3. THE HOLY SPIRIT USES ANGELS AS EXAMPLES

The Holy Spirit often reveals to us how angels behave to teach us how we should treat people. Just as angels are quiet, respectful, and full of care, we too must handle people's secrets, struggles, and stories with gentleness. Whether someone shares their pain in church or in a personal chat, treat it as holy. Don't repeat what they said. The Holy Spirit convicts us when we cross that line.

Scripture: James 1:17 — "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father..."

4. GUARD PERSONAL INFORMATION DURING MINISTRY

When praying for someone in church or in public ministry, be cautious not to speak their personal problems out loud on a microphone. It may embarrass or shame them. Speak wisely. You can pray for healing without revealing the sickness. You can cast out fear without naming past abuse. Honor their dignity like God honors yours. Jesus never shamed people publicly; He restored them.

Scripture: 1 Peter 4:8 — "Love covers over a multitude of sins."

5. HEAVEN OPERATES WITH PURE MOTIVES

In Heaven, no one shares stories to feel important or gain attention. Testimonies are shared with permission and purpose. No one uses someone else's private pain as content for conversation. If Heaven does not allow this kind of behavior, then as believers, we must also refuse it. Always ask: "Would I want my story shared like this?"

Scripture: Philippians 2:3 — "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."

6. NO GOSSIP IN HEAVEN

There is no gossip or whispering in Heaven. Everyone walks in perfect love and honor. No one laughs at others' failures. When someone makes progress or overcomes, all of Heaven celebrates with joy. Angels never remind people of past sins—they focus on who God made you to be. If we want Heaven on Earth, we must remove gossip and mocking from our lives.

Scripture: Proverbs 20:19 — "A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid anyone who talks too much."

7. HONOR PEOPLE'S STORIES AS SACRED

When someone opens up about a past hurt, trauma, or failure, realize they're trusting you with something precious. Don't interrupt, judge, or correct them too quickly. Listen with the heart of God. The angels listen with patience. If God trusts you with someone's pain, respond with care—not curiosity.

Scripture: Galatians 6:2 — "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."

8. DO NOT USE SOMEONE'S PAIN TO PREACH

Even if someone's story would make a powerful sermon illustration, don't share it unless they've given permission. Don't say, "A sister in church went through this..." unless God has released you and the person is aware. The pulpit is not a place to tell people's secrets. The Holy Spirit will give you wisdom to speak truth without violating trust.

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 3:7 — "A time to be silent and a time to speak."

9. GOD HIMSELF COVERS OUR PAST

God does not keep reminding us of our past mistakes. He buries them. He doesn't hold them against us. If God treats us with such mercy, then we must learn to do the same for others. If someone confesses a struggle, don't keep bringing it up or treating them differently. Forgive, forget, and love like Heaven does.

Scripture: Psalm 103:12 — “As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us.”

10. YOUR WORDS CAN WOUND OR HEAL

When you misuse someone’s private story, it can deeply wound them. But when you guard it like treasure, it brings healing and trust. Let your words be safe, healing, and filled with grace. This is how Heaven communicates—always with love and purpose.

Scripture: Proverbs 18:21 — “The tongue has the power of life and death...”

Title: GOD IS STILL WITH YOU – DON’T GIVE UP – Pastor Paul Silway

1. JESUS LOVES YOU AND HE HASN’T CHANGED.

Even when life gets hard, Jesus still loves you. His love doesn’t stop because of your pain or problems. He understands your broken heart. He sees every tear. His love for you is forever.

2. YOU ARE NEVER ALONE—JESUS IS WITH YOU.

Even if you feel no one cares, Jesus is right there beside you. He promised never to leave you. When others leave, He stays. Even in the darkest times, He is your light.

3. GOD IS BIGGER THAN YOUR PROBLEMS.

Your situation might feel too heavy, but nothing is too hard for God. He is still working, even when you can’t see it. His power is greater than your pain. He is in control, not your problems.

4. DON’T STOP BELIEVING—HOLD ON TO FAITH.

When everything feels like it’s falling apart, keep trusting. Faith means believing even when you don’t understand. God sees your faith, even when it’s small. He is working on your behalf.

5. A NEW DAY IS COMING—DON’T GIVE UP.

Your story is not over. Help is on the way. Healing will come. Peace will return. You are loved, seen, and chosen by God—and He is not finished with you.

6. YOU ARE BEING LIFTED IN PRAYER.

I am praying for you—everyone who reads this. I believe your breakthrough is near. You are not forgotten—you are loved, chosen, and seen by God. A new season of peace and joy is coming. Don’t give up—God is for you, and He’s not finished with your story.

THE LIES OF MOCK HELL – EXPOSING SATAN’S DECEPTIONS – Pastor Paul Silway

Part 1: WHAT IS MOCK HELL?

1. There is a place in the spirit realm that is not the real hell—it is a fake hell, created by Satan to deceive people. It is called Mock Hell. It looks like the real hell but is completely false. It is designed by the enemy to confuse, scare, and turn people away from the truth.

John 8:44 – “...When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies.”

Part 2: SATAN SHOWS LIES IN MOCK HELL

2. Many people have shared visions where they say they saw Christians in hell. Some said they saw pastors, women wearing pants or makeup, even babies in hell. But this is not true. These are lies of mock hell, not real hell.

3. One man wrote in his book that he saw babies in hell being tormented—demons mocking them, breaking their hands and legs. This is not possible, because babies are innocent. A loving God would never send babies to hell.

Matthew 19:14 – “Jesus said, ‘Let the little children come to me... for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.’”

Part 3: WHY PEOPLE BELIEVE THESE LIES

4. These false visions are usually shown to people who are not deeply rooted in God’s Word. They may be Christians, but they lack strong spiritual understanding. Satan takes advantage of their lack of knowledge.

Hosea 4:6 – “My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge...”

5. Satan shows people that women are in hell because they wore makeup or pants. He shows pastors in hell because of how they dressed. He shows these images to make people believe that God is harsh and unloving. But this is not true.

1 Samuel 16:7 – “The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.”

Part 4: THE PURPOSE OF MOCK HELL

6. Satan creates this fake place to:

- Scare believers
- Accuse God falsely
- Bring fear, confusion, and pain
- Turn people away from Jesus

7. If people believe that God sends innocent babies to hell or punishes people for wearing jeans or makeup, they may begin to dislike or fear God, instead of trusting Him. That’s exactly what Satan wants.

2 Corinthians 2:11 – “...in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes.”

Part 5: WHAT THE BIBLE REALLY SAYS ABOUT SALVATION

8. The Bible is very clear. Salvation is through faith in Jesus Christ, not through clothing, appearance, or works.

Ephesians 2:8-9 – “For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast.”

9. A true believer in Jesus who sincerely accepts Him as Lord and Savior is not going to hell. God doesn’t take away salvation like a punishment. He is merciful and faithful.

Romans 11:29 – “For God’s gifts and his call are irrevocable.”

Part 6: THE TRUTH ABOUT CHILDREN AND BABIES

10. God does not send children or babies to hell. Children who die before the age of maturity go to be with Jesus. Their spirits are precious to Him. Anyone who says babies are burning in hell is repeating a lie from mock hell.

Deuteronomy 1:39 – “...your children who do not yet know good from bad—they will enter the land...”

Matthew 18:10 – “...their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven.”

Part 7: TEST EVERY VISION AND MESSAGE

11. We must test every vision, dream, or message. Not everything that seems spiritual is from God. If a vision makes you afraid, confused, or paints God as cruel, it is not from the Holy Spirit.

1 John 4:1 – “Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God...”

12. The Holy Spirit brings peace and truth. Satan brings fear and lies. That is why you must always ask: Does this line up with what the Bible says?

Part 8: STAY ROOTED IN THE WORD

13. The only way to avoid deception is to know the Word of God. People who don't read the Bible can easily be tricked into believing fake visions.

Psalm 119:105 – “Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.”

Colossians 3:16 – “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...”

Part 9: GOD IS LOVING AND JUST

14. God is not a cruel judge. He is a loving Father. He doesn't want anyone to perish, and He never punishes people for simple things like clothing or hairstyles.

2 Peter 3:9 – “He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.”

Psalm 103:8 – “The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love.”

Part 10: FINAL WORDS – BE WISE, BE FREE

15. Dear reader, do not believe every book, message, or story that someone tells. Mock hell is real in the spirit realm, but it is not the real hell. It is a trap made by Satan.

16. If you have accepted Jesus and are living by faith, you are safe in His love. God does not lie. His promises are true. Do not let fear steal your peace.

John 10:28-29 – “I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand.”

GOD IS NOT SENDING REVIVAL – HE IS COMING TO STAY! By Pastor Paul Silway

(A Message About Habitation, Not Just Revival)

Many Are Preaching About Revival – But the True Message from the Father's Heart for This Time Is Habitation.

Let us not miss what Heaven is saying in this hour. While revival brings powerful moments of God's touch, habitation is about God coming to dwell with us permanently. This is the deep desire of our loving Father—that we would become His resting place on Earth.

Come, let us learn together from the Holy Spirit what this truly means, and how we can prepare our hearts to welcome His presence—not just for a moment, but forever.

1. REVIVAL COMES AND GOES

1. For many years, people have prayed and waited for revival.
2. Revival means God moves powerfully for a time—many are saved, healed, and filled with the Holy Spirit.
3. But most revivals in history did not last.
4. After a few months or years, things returned to normal, and people went back to their old ways.
5. Revival is powerful, but it is temporary.

2. WHAT IS HABITATION?

6. Habitation means God is not just visiting—He is coming to live among His people.
7. It is not just a move of God, but God Himself staying with us always.
8. When God comes to live among His people, everything changes—forever.
9. His presence won't just be in meetings but in homes, streets, cities, schools, and workplaces.
10. God wants His people to become His dwelling place.

3. HABITATION IS GOD'S PLAN NOW

11. This time, God is not sending just a revival—He is coming to stay.
12. He wants to fill the earth with His glory and His presence like never before.
13. He wants His people to live holy lives, carry His love, walk in power, and always stay close to Him.
14. This is not a short season—it is a new way of life for those who say "Yes" to Him.
15. Habitation is about relationship, not just miracles or meetings.

4. GOD IS PREPARING HIS PEOPLE

16. God is preparing those who are hungry, obedient, and humble.
17. These people will become carriers of His presence every day—not just in church, but everywhere they go.
18. God will pour out His Spirit in a deep and lasting way in these days.
19. The fire of God is coming to burn away the old and make room for the new.
20. He is raising up people who love Him more than fame, money, or comfort.
5. WILL YOU BE READY?
21. You must be ready to welcome Him, not just His blessings.
22. Say "Yes, Lord. Come and live in me and through me."
23. Let go of the old ways, the routine, the religion without power.
24. Let your life become a place where God can dwell—full of love, truth, and purity.
25. God is not looking for perfect people, but for willing people.

6. A NEW ERA HAS BEGUN

26. This is not the end—it is the beginning of something new.
27. The Church will no longer be weak or hidden. It will shine with God's glory.
28. People everywhere will see and feel the presence of God in believers.
29. Cities will be changed. Families will be restored. Nations will be shaken.
30. This is the day of habitation, not just revival. God is coming to stay.

FREEDOM FROM FEAR: THE TRUTH ABOUT THE RAPTURE AND THE GLORIOUS FUTURE OF THE CHURCH – By Pastor Paul Silway

Many Christians today are worried—even terrified—about the Rapture.

This fear has been spread by teachings that use the topic of the Rapture to pressure believers into serving God out of fear, not out of love. But fear can never produce true and lasting service. God does not motivate us through fear, but through love, faith, and hope.

Let's be clear: the Rapture is not something a believer needs to fear. It's a blessed event. Even if you're not constantly thinking about the Rapture or if it takes you by surprise, you will still be caught up to meet the Lord if you are in Christ.

Staying up all night worrying that you'll "miss it" is unnecessary. Unfortunately, fear-based messages have made the Rapture seem like something terrifying rather than joyful.

1. INFORMATION WITHOUT REVELATION

Many Christians today only have head knowledge about the Rapture, not revelation knowledge.

Revelation brings peace and clarity, not confusion and fear. Before the Rapture takes place, several prophetic events still need to unfold.

For example:

- The wealth of the wicked must be transferred to the righteous (Proverbs 13:22).
- Believers will be known for their supernatural love for one another (John 13:35).
- Jesus said in John 14:12 that those who believe in Him would do the works He did—and even greater. Has the Church globally walked in this yet? No.

So why are people expecting to leave so soon?

2. THE GLORY WILL ALWAYS OUTSHINE THE DARKNESS

Yes, darkness may cover the earth. But it will never overcome the light. The Church is not called to hide or run, but to shine brighter. God's plan is not for His Church to be weak, scared, and hiding. His plan is glory, honor, and dominion.

3. DITCH THE DOOM AND GLOOM

Let's stop talking about doom and start living with expectation. We are entering the greatest days the Church has ever seen! Let's reject the "escape plan" and the mindset that makes us feel like we are barely surviving. We are not victims—we are victorious! This is not the time to fear. This is the time to rise and shine.

4. NOT EVERYONE IS CALLED TO SPEAK ON THE RAPTURE

Many who are teaching about the last days are just repeating what they've heard from others. They haven't received a personal word from God. This spreads fear and steals joy. Instead of being excited about their future, many Christians have become confused, anxious, and passive. We must not let others drag us into their fear-based version of the future.

5. ARE YOU PREPARING TO LEAVE OR TO SHINE?

When you constantly long for the Rapture just to escape, you develop a victim mentality. But Jesus is returning for a glorious Church, not a defeated one. He's coming for a bride full of light, joy, and strength, not a group begging to escape tribulation.

God has a divine timeline. He is not reacting to the evil in the world. He sent Jesus the first time according to His own plan, not because things were too bad to delay. And He will send Him again in the same way—on time, not out of fear or crisis.

6. A PICTURE OF THE END-TIME CHURCH: A BRIDE BEING HONORED

In the natural, as a bride's wedding day approaches, she is increasingly honored and blessed. Gifts come from every side. Joy fills the air.

That's the same for us—we are the Bride of Christ! As His return draws closer, the blessings and glory upon the Church will increase, not decrease.

Don't expect to go out in fear. Expect to go out in glory.

7. STAY—DON'T RUN

God is calling you to stay and reign, not run and hide. A person who wants to escape cannot fulfill their divine assignment. Satan wants to steal your destiny by filling you with fear and hopelessness. If you constantly think about leaving, you may even shorten your days.

Even the Apostle Paul faced this choice. He said in Philippians 1:23–25 that though he desired to depart and be with Christ, he chose to remain—for the sake of others' growth and joy. That's the kind of maturity we need in these times.

8. THE DANGEROUS IMPACT OF FEAR-BASED TEACHING

I have personally counseled and prayed with thousands of believers who are suffering silently. The common thread? They are trapped by fear and depression because of messages about doom, gloom, and an "imminent" Rapture.

Fear paralyzes. It blocks people from praying, working, growing, or enjoying life. It steals their power and their joy. Depression is not just sadness—it's spiritual oppression. It makes people feel hopeless, isolated, and weak. Some have even stopped planning for their future—avoiding marriage, children, and career because they believe there's no time left.

This is not the will of God.

9. DECEPTION IS A POWERFUL WEAPON

Deception blinds people. And the most dangerous part is that the deceived person doesn't even know they're deceived. That's why Jesus, in Matthew 24, Mark 13, and Luke 21, warned His disciples: "Do not be deceived."

Satan's only real power is deception. When you discover the truth, his power is broken. The truth sets you free. And the truth is this: it is not the time for wrath—it's the time for glory.

10. THIS IS THE TIME TO OCCUPY, NOT ESCAPE

Jesus never said, "Get ready to run away." He said, "Occupy till I come" (Luke 19:13). As long as you have water to drink and the sky is blue, we are not in the Tribulation. We are not waiting to survive—we are called to thrive.

11. WHAT TIME ARE WE IN?

We are in the time of Heaven being released on earth. God is preparing the Church for a golden age of glory, not a time of fear. Heaven will invade earth. God's glory will cover the nations. Angels will be active in new ways. It's a time for freedom, creativity, wealth, supernatural joy, and protection.

This is a Holy Season. God is revealing mysteries, restoring lives, healing families, and releasing signs, wonders, and miracles. The Church is stepping into its authority. Now is the time for sons and daughters of God to manifest.

12. PARENTS, TEACH YOUR CHILDREN HOPE

Don't pass on fear to the next generation. Don't tell your children that the world is only getting worse and they should just plan to escape. Teach them instead that they are called to greatness. Their future is not filled with fear—it's filled with purpose.

Their calling is not to hide under desks in fear of the end, but to rise as leaders and carriers of the glory of God.

FINAL WORDS

This is not the end. This is not the time for fear. This is the greatest hour for the Church.

If you've been living under fear, I urge you to let go of it. Step into faith, step into peace, and step into your calling. Hear the full message of the Rapture and the end times with fresh eyes and a heart ready for revelation. Share this with those you know are struggling.

Freedom from fear begins with truth. The Rapture is not the problem—fear is. Let's set people free.

If you're struggling with fear, depression, or confusion about the end times, I want you to know—you don't have to stay that way. I'm here to stand with you, to pray for you, and to help you walk in the truth that sets you free.

Don't let fear-based messages control your life. God has called you to live in peace, walk in power, and fulfill your purpose with joy and hope.

This is not your time to run or hide—it's your time to rise. Choose to stay. Choose to shine. Choose to reign.

THE WHOLE BIBLE IN BRIEF - By Pastor Paul Silway

GOD IS THE CREATOR

God is the Creator, so He is greater than all His creation. Revelation 4:11 says God created all things for His own pleasure. No one told Him to do it—there was no one else.

Our God is a Trinity—Father, Son (Christ), and Holy Spirit. They have always existed.

GOD CREATES ANGELS

God was the only life form in existence. When He created angels, He used a portion of the life within Him.

First, He created angels. Hebrews 12:22 says their number is countless—even beyond what humans or computers can count.

Then God created the universe, Earth, and all life on it. Birds and animals were created male and female so they could reproduce according to their kind.

GOD CREATED MAN

God created man in His image and placed him in paradise on Earth, meant to be as joyful as Heaven. God saw man (later named Adam) was alone. Though everything God created was good, man needed a companion.

So God took a part of Adam and made woman to be his help and partner.

Then man was no longer alone. The Holy Spirit showed that it is God's plan for no one to be alone. Before creating man, God watered the Earth through a mist (Genesis 2:6).

God made man and woman male and female for the purpose of producing offspring (Genesis 1:27-28).

God created only two sexes—male and female. He did not create more or mix the two. Any other idea is not from God (Genesis 1:27).

LUCIFER BECOMES SATAN

God did not create Satan as His enemy. Lucifer chose to become Satan. He stopped worshiping God and tried to lead other angels away too (Isaiah 14:12-13).

SIN ENTERS THE WORLD

The first sinner on Earth was Satan. He became a fallen angel by rebelling against God. He was judged and sentenced to Hell forever. Satan tempted Eve and Adam in Eden, which began sin on Earth.

Satan and his demons are still sinners and will try to destroy people until they are sent to Hell. When humans sin, they open the door to Satan's attacks.

WHAT SIN DID TO MANKIND

Lucifer (Satan) introduced sin to humanity by tempting Adam and Eve. Since then, sin has been passed to all people.

Romans 6:23 says the wages of sin is death. We are sinners by nature, not just by action.

Psalm 51:5 says we are sinful from birth.

SIN SEPARATES US FROM GOD AND HEAVEN

Romans 6:23 and Ephesians 2:1 show that being separate from God means we are spiritually dead.

Ephesians 4:18 and Colossians 1:21 say sin hardens hearts and makes us enemies of God.

This separation dooms us to eternity without God.

GOD IS JUST

God is just, so sin must be punished. He cannot ignore sin. Before Jesus came, animal sacrifices were used as a substitute for man's sin.

Hebrews 9:22 says without shedding of blood, there is no forgiveness.

Matthew 1:21 says Jesus came to save us from sin.

Romans 3:23 says all have sinned and need a Savior.

Romans 6:23 says the wages of sin is death, but God's gift is eternal life through Jesus.

If we don't accept Jesus, we will die in our sins and be eternally separated from God.

JESUS NOT ONLY PAID FOR SIN BUT ALSO BROUGHT HEALING

Death came because of sin—spiritual death immediately, and physical death over time. With it came sickness.

When man fell, the earth was cursed. Genesis 3:17-19 says sorrow, thorns, and hard labor came because of sin.

Sickness is an early form of death. If sin is the root, sickness is the fruit.

Psalm 103:1-5 says God forgives sins and heals diseases.

We are told not to forget God's benefits. Sin brings aging and stress, but God renews us.

Isaiah 53:4-5 says Jesus bore our sickness and pain.

1 Peter 2:24 says we were healed by His wounds.

Jesus took our sins and sickness to the cross. Salvation and healing come from Him. Because healing is already given, believers don't need to ask for it—they need to receive what belongs to them.

HELL WAS MADE FOR SATAN, BUT OTHERS CAN END UP THERE

Jesus said Hell was prepared for Satan and his demons (Matthew 25:41).

Those who reject Jesus will also go there (2 Peter 2:4-9).

But salvation is available for anyone who trusts in Jesus (John 3:16, 36; 5:24).

HOW CAN WE GO TO HEAVEN

Acts 4:12 says salvation is found in no one else but Jesus.

Many believe all paths lead to Heaven, but Jesus said in John 14:6 that He is the only way.

John 3:36 says those who believe in Jesus have eternal life, but those who reject Him face God's wrath.

We all deserve judgment, but Jesus died for our sins so we could be saved. Some want a loving God without judgment or change, but the Bible is clear—Jesus is the only way.

1 John 5:12 says if you have the Son, you have life. If not, you do not have life.

John 1:12 says those who believe in Jesus become God's children.

Those who accept His sacrifice are saved. Those who reject it are not.

John 3:18 says those who do not believe are already condemned.

Heaven will be wonderful for those who accept Christ. But Hell will be horrible for those who reject Him. The Bible is clear—Jesus is the only way to Heaven.

THREE WONDERFUL TRUTHS ABOUT THE ATONEMENT

Do we truly understand the power of what Jesus did for us on the cross?

Atonement means Jesus paid the price for our sins by shedding His blood. According to God's divine law:

“Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins.” – Hebrews 9:22

2. GOD DESIRES ONE ACCORD AMONG HIS CHILDREN

- Acts 2:1 - The early Church was in "one accord."
- God desires that same unity today.
- Division comes from pride, comparison, and competition.

True unity comes when we stop comparing and start serving.

3. NO COMPETITION IN MARRIAGE

- A husband and wife are not meant to compete, but to complete each other.
- Satan uses competition to divide and destroy relationships.

Our Father's plan is not that a husband and wife build two individual lives, but that they build one life together."

4. LET US FOCUS ON OUR ASSIGNMENT

- Don't look at what others are doing. Focus on what God called you to do.
- Like the angels, help and support others in their callings.

Romans 12:4-5 - We are one body with many functions.

5. ALL GLORY BELONGS TO GOD

- In everything we do, we point to Jesus.
- We serve, not to be praised, but to glorify Him.

1 Corinthians 10:31 - "Whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God."

FINAL ENCOURAGEMENT:

Stop competing. Start cooperating. Serve God with humility. Honor others. Let your only goal be to please the Father. Like the angels, do your assignment with joy, without seeking credit, and in one accord with your brothers and sisters.

PRAYER:

Lord, help me walk in humility and unity. Take away any spirit of competition or pride from my heart. Let me serve faithfully, without comparing myself to others. Use me for Your glory. Amen.

WHY ISN'T THERE NIGHT IN HEAVEN? Pastor Paul Silway

God made the night on the earth, so that our physical body could be refreshed through sleep. In Heaven, we never need sleep, because our spiritual body doesn't get tired, so there is no need for night time. The Glory of God lights Heaven so there is no sun or moon, but many times the sky changes with amazing shades of colour not on this earth.

HOLY SPIRIT: "Most importantly though is the fact that there will not be any night or darkness in Heaven. (See Revelation 21:23-25.) When the future becomes now and the time factor is not present anymore, there will not be any nights and days, as you now know night and day. Neither will there be any sun or moon because Our Father, Who is light, will be the total light in Heaven for all of Heaven all through eternity. The hymn writers who wrote about there not being a night in Heaven understood a great truth."

Holy Spirit led me to these verses:

23 And the city has no need of sun or moon, for the glory of God illuminates the city, and the Lamb is its light.

24 The nations will walk in its light, and the kings of the world will enter the city in all their glory.

25 Its gates will never be closed at the end of day because there is no night there.

26 And all the nations will bring their glory and honor into the city.

27 Nothing evil[f] will be allowed to enter, nor anyone who practices shameful idolatry and dishonesty—but only those whose names are written in the Lamb's Book of Life.

NO CHURCH BUILDINGS IN HEAVEN - Pastor Paul Silway

(This message is from the Holy Spirit)

HOLY SPIRIT: When you read Revelation 19:1-7 it should be noted that there are not any Church buildings in Our Father's Home. This is important to note as on Planet Earth some Church buildings are big and elaborate, and some are small with only the bare necessities. The result is that people on Planet Earth considered to be **GREAT** usually worship together, and that people on Planet Earth considered to be **SMALL** usually worship together.

ME: Dear Holy Spirit, why are there no Church buildings in Heaven?

HOLY SPIRIT: "The reason there are not any Church buildings in Our Father's Home is that the **LORD GOD ALMIGHTY IS THE TEMPLE** (See Revelation 21:22).

Revelation 21:22 says, **AND I SAW NO TEMPLE**, for the Lord God Almighty is its temple, even the Lamb.

HOLY SPIRIT: "Since Our Father does not consider some Saints to be great and some to be small, all will be worshipping together because all are equally important to Him. Also read Revelation 19: 1-7."

Revelation 19:1 And after these things I heard a great sound of a numerous crowd in Heaven, saying, Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and honor and the power to the Lord our God!

God has a special role for fathers to play in the life of the children. Earthly fathers are an expression of God's Fatherly love. So, I encourage you fathers and grandfathers or grandparents to continue to fulfill life's greatest assignment that is to pray and raise your children in godliness.

This is the responsibility God has placed on fathers or parents. Father's Day, maybe the designated Day to celebrate; but God celebrates all the good things that you do in the lives of your children.

The Holy Spirit told me that your beloved children belonged to God first before they belonged to you for God LOANED them to you for a while on this earth.

God knew them first before you knew them. God loved them first before you started to love them. You knew them after they were born; but God knew them before they were born on this earth.

Now let me share some mysteries or secrets that the Holy Spirit revealed to me:

CHILDREN: God chose your parents for you

PARENTS: God chose your children for you.

You didn't choose for yourself who your parents should be, or who your children should be. God didn't even ask who you want your parents to be or who you want your children to be.

If God would have asked the children, they would have said, "We want to be born in a palace or in the richest family.

If God would have asked the parents, they would have said, we want the most handsome son and the most beautiful daughter. They would have said, God please give us the most obedient daughter and the most obedient son who will take care of us.

CHILDREN obey and respect your parents that God gave to you

PARENTS love and take care of your children that God gave you

Children, remember, your parents did their best to take care of you in this world surrounded by evil where Satan has built the world contrary to God.

Children, your parents may have disciplined you for your good. Some could have been harsh but all for your good. I know some grown-up children who have gone astray later said, "I wish my parents would have been strict with me."

Ephesians 6:14 says, Children obey your parents, both your father and mother, especially those who are in the Lord for this is right according to God and the ways of Heaven.

Honor your father and mother.

Why?

That it may go well with you and that you may live a long life on earth."

Hebrews 12:6 says, "Even the Lord of Heaven disciplines those whom HE LOVES (not hates) and punishes each one He accepts as His child." Here we see He punishes and disciplines those on the outside as well as those on the inside that is the Church.

Satan may tell you, God hates you so He is disciplining you, but the Bible says contrary that He loves you, so he disciplines you. Be careful what you hear.

Some Christians have had abusive parents. Regarding this matter I will write in another message.

Hebrews 12:5 says, "My son do not make light of the Lord's discipline and don't give up when He corrects you."

Many leave the Lord; get angry or aggravated when they are under the discipline of the Lord. They may leave the church; stop studying the Bible, stop praying, stop fellowshipping and even stop working for the Lord.

Hebrews 12:7 says, "Even during discipline remember that God is treating you as His own child"

Verse 7 says, "Who has ever heard of a child who is never disciplined by his or her own father."

If God doesn't discipline you as He does all his children; it means you are illegitimate and are not his child at all. Share this with everyone because many children speak against their parents and hurt and grieve them. Some children even go to the extent of waiting for their parents to die; so that they can get their property. Being a pastor I have witnessed and heard about all this when parents come to me for prayer.

Some children keep in their hearts all the chastening and discipline their parents did even after more than 20 or 30 years which shows they are so bitter about their parents. They have carried the wrong stuff with them and around them and attached this filth to them, bringing them into their own married life and making their new family and their children live in them. They don't know the disaster they are causing in their life, family and children.

Children you can compliment your spouse, parents, family, and friends, but you should never worship them as God. Forgive your parents, family, and your spouse for what they did against you and also repent of what you did against them which is the right and the correct thing to do.

HOLY SPIRIT: "Unforgiveness always gives Satan an advantage over your life and forgiveness always takes advantage away from Satan. Remember, our Heavenly Father has both the qualities of fatherhood and motherhood quality of God."

HOLY SPIRIT: "Let me talk to you fathers: Your role of fatherhood has its basis in Our Father being a father to you in the spirit realm. Our Father is a true father to you. Regardless of how many people may be living on Planet Earth, Our Father will continue to know each one of you personally. Regardless of how many angels and saints there will be in Heaven, Our Father will continue to know each one of you on a personal basis. When you are in Heaven and the time factor will not exist any longer, Our Father will still be a father to you."

OFFENCE – BAIT OF SATAN – Pastor Paul Silway

In my more than thirty years as a Pastor and Teacher in church leadership, by far the most productive bait I've seen that Satan and Demons our spiritual enemy uses to entrap Christians is the BAIT OF OFFENSE.

I have seen some are offended even for good reason like they were corrected or disciplined because of which they carry bitterness. One of the reasons for cancer and tumor is bitterness. Nothing happens suddenly. Maybe you are carrying an unhealthy soul for long and since you were ignorant so you did nothing. The Bible says ignorance of God's Word is destructive.

I have seen so many Christians take the bait of Satan. The traps that your spiritual enemy lays for you are both hidden and baited.

But the offence itself – does not entrap us. It's when we take that bait and become offended that we can quickly find ourselves entrapped by the enemy for years and years – or even for a lifetime.

An offended person produces some of the best fruit on behalf of our spiritual enemy, Satan and Demons like Anger, bitterness, resentment, hate, strife, envy, and hell's favourite fruit – hatred. It's very easy for the devil to work in a heart of hate which is his eternal nature.

I have seen many Christians run here and there wanting God to do something for them. They have missed my teaching about God's part and Man's part. God won't do your part and you can't do God's part. Each must do their part. God has already done His part and finished it.

Many Christians tell God to do His part of giving and also do our part of receiving for us.

Hear today's message and get yourself freed before it becomes a stronghold in your life and then you need deliverance, not just simple prayer.

I know and have seen many people suffering from many sicknesses and diseases, especially cancer and tumours. Do not take spiritual things lightly for your real answer comes from there.

Come personally today and the Pastor will pray for you!

GIFTS & TALENTS – Pastor Paul Silway

This is the Holy Spirit's given message for the entire Body of Christ. Please hear this message and don't miss it as God has given me revelations regarding this topic. . Please do share it with all our church body so that you will be blessed too.

We All Have Specific Destinies And God Gives Us The Gifts & Talents To Accomplish It. God Has Knit Talents & Abilities In You At The Time Of Conception.

You don't become SUPERIOR because of your given Gifts, talents or abilities. The Bible says in 1 Corinthians 4:7 For who MAKES YOU SO SUPERIOR? What do you have that you did not receive? And if you did receive it, why do you boast as though you did not?

THE BABY DEDICATION - - Pastor Paul Silway

(A message by Our Heavenly Father to the parents)

Many Christian parents and even some leaders do the dedication of the child as a tradition or because others do or because they are asked to do. One thing we must remember is that only when we have a revelation from the Holy Spirit about the baby's dedication will our faith work for faith comes when you have revelation knowledge of God's Word. Someone who dedicates as a tradition does not do it by faith and as a result can't release the blessing of dedication.

The Holy Spirit has given me some revelations of baby dedication. I will give only a little bit about the teaching that the Holy Spirit gave me as I need to explain in detail about each revelation.

NOW YOU MAY ASK ME SEVERAL QUESTIONS:

1. When should a child be dedicated?
2. What is the age of accountability or Age of Choosing of a baby?
3. What is the cut-off age of a baby when the baby has to begin the experience of repentance?
4. Do the babies have angels assigned by Our Father and how many?
5. Do the angels leave the baby when it grows up? At what age do the angels leave the baby and why and how do they come back?
6. Do the unbeliever children have angels with them?
7. Why do the baby's smile and laugh? Is it because they see angels?

And several more I will explain little by little so that you can do a better dedication to the baby.

HOLY SPIRIT: "If Christian parents wish to dedicate their child to Christ, then a baby dedication service is entirely appropriate. Even the Angels of the baby are strengthened and they become very happy. Our Father in heaven, Our Lord Jesus Christ and ME (Holy Spirit) and all the angels are there to witness this Heavenly celebration which is very close to Our Father's heart."

However, even if infants are dedicated to the Lord, when they grow up they will still have to make a personal decision to believe in Jesus Christ in order to be saved.

It is important for the parents of the child to give their child the opportunity to begin the experience of repentance when the child comes to the Age of Choosing

Our Heavenly Father gives very special attention to small children. When the parents bring their child to be dedicated by the Pastor who is a full time called by our Father the parents must give thanks to Our Father for the gift of the baby and make their promises to raise their child in the ways of the Lord.

I have seen and known that at least four Angels are with the little baby. It is also interesting that the Angels always manifest themselves about the size of the little baby being dedicated and with little wings extended to fly around the baby.

It is important for the parents of the child to give their child the opportunity to begin the experience of repentance when the child comes to the Age of Choosing. Repentance is something that each one of us has to do individually for ourselves.

A TIMELY TOPIC - Never Let Anger Control You (It can also lead to cancer)

Anger can indeed have negative impacts on both mental and physical health. Holding onto anger can lead to stress, anxiety, and even physical ailments. It's essential to address and manage anger in healthy ways.

This Sunday the Holy Spirit wants me to talk about anger which may destroy your health and is one of the leading reasons many are not healed.

I'm telling you, anger is doing so much damage to people's lives and so much damage to their health that it's not healthy to be angry.

One classical example I have shared before is that many years ago as a young pastor I met a lady, about sixty-five years old, who told me that twenty years previously her brother had cheated her out of some estate money when their parents died.

She told me that she had been carrying anger and hurt from this for those twenty years, and I could sense these feelings were very strong within her. Two months later she told me the doctor had diagnosed her with cancer, and six months later she died.

Now I know that this type of thing is not the only reason people get cancer, but in this case the Holy Spirit told me it was. Even though I was only a young pastor I sensed the Holy Spirit telling me that the anger and hate within the lady kept Our Father's Grace from healing her when she got cancer.

Don't miss this session as I am going to pray over all those who have carried anger for long and I am going to break it in Jesus name. This I can do only to those who attend personally!

TRUE PROPHETS AND FALSE PROPHETS – Pastor Paul Silway

Holy Spirit was teaching me how to recognize true prophets from the false prophets and there is one more category He said which is called a PROPHET IN ERROR which I will write in another message. ME: "Holy Spirit led me to some Scriptures, and made comments about the Scriptures."

SCRIPTURE ONE

Deuteronomy 13:1-3:

13 If a prophet, or one who foretells by dreams, appears among you and announces to you a sign or wonder, 2 and if the sign or wonder spoken of takes place, and the prophet says, "Let us follow other gods" (gods you have not known) "and let us worship them," 3 you must not listen to the words of that prophet or dreamer. The LORD your God is testing you to find out whether you love him with all your heart and with all your soul.

HOLY SPIRIT: "First of all, it is important to note the timing of this Scripture. The Holy Spirit gave this Scripture in the beginning part of the Old Testament. Thus from the beginning of the Bible, the Holy Spirit has been giving guidance about believers knowing the difference between true prophets and false prophets. Secondly, the guideline has never been to use the PERSONALITY, THE ANOINTING, OR THE MIRACLES IN THE MINISTRY OF ONE PROFESSING TO BE A TRUE PROPHET to determine whether the person is a true prophet or prophetess. Thirdly, the only factor to be used in this determination is to see if the prophetic utterances add to the UNDERSTANDING of truth the Holy Spirit has recorded in the Scriptures. The basic truth the Holy Spirit was speaking about in this beginning part of the Old Testament is that Our Father's Chosen People were to worship only one God, Our Father. Any prophetic utterance that added to or subtracted from this truth was a false utterance of prophecy, and did not come from Our Father through the Holy Spirit."

SCRIPTURE TWO

Mark 13:22: For false messiahs and FALSE PROPHETS will rise up and perform signs and wonders so as to deceive, IF POSSIBLE, even God's chosen ones. 23 Watch out! I have warned you about this ahead of time!

HOLY SPIRIT: "In the ministry of Christ Your Lord while He was on Planet Earth, He recognized that there were both true prophets and false prophets. He stated that it was important for His Followers to know the difference between the two. Our Father permits Satan to have false prophets mimic the anointing of the Holy Spirit, and to do some signs and wonders, for the purpose of giving Me (Holy Spirit) the opportunity to teach Born Again Christians the difference between true prophets and false prophets."

SCRIPTURE THREE

1 John 4:1-3:

"Beloved, do not believe everyone who claims to speak by the Holy Spirit. You must test them to see if the spirit they have comes from God. For, there are many false prophets in the world. 2 This is how we know if they have the Spirit of God: If a person claiming to be a prophet[a] acknowledges that Jesus Christ came in a real body, that person has the Spirit of God. 3 But if someone claims to be a prophet and does not acknowledge the truth about Jesus, that person is not from God. Such a person has the spirit of the Antichrist, which you heard is coming into the world and indeed is already here."

HOLY SPIRIT: "In this Scripture I (Holy Spirit) again repeated the teaching that not every one who claims to be a true prophet is a true prophet, as the spirit of antichrist is already on Planet Earth and influences some to be false prophets, I (Holy Spirit) can help Born Again Christians to know the difference between true prophets and false prophets.

ME: "Holy Spirit, Please teach us about the three spirits."

HOLY SPIRIT: "There are three possible spirits that can influence a person to speak of the truths of the Bible - (1) Me, that is, Holy Spirit, (2) Satan, and, (3) one's personal self-spirit. When a person professes to be speaking as a true prophet, I (Holy Spirit) can help Born Again Christians to distinguish which of these three spirits are influencing the person. The guideline is that if I (Holy Spirit) am inspiring the person, he or she will be speaking Biblical understanding about the teachings and ministry of Christ Your Lord. If one adds to or subtracts from what is stated in the Bible about this matter, that one is a false prophet.

HOLY SPIRIT: There is a sense in which a false prophet may speak in error because Satan directs him or her, and either adds to or subtracts from a truth what I (Holy Spirit) inspired to be written into the Bible. The next teaching that I (Holy Spirit) will have you write about in your next report will be about a PROPHET IN ERROR.

JESUS ROSE UP FROM THE DEAD
(Only One Tomb is empty)

You see virtually every other religion CELEBRATES THE BIRTH and OBSERVES THE DEATH of their leader.

But Christianity is the ONLY religion that CELEBRATES THE BIRTH, OBSERVES THE DEATH, and PROCLAIMS THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LEADER!

Only ONE TOMB is EMPTY - that is Jesus' tomb. That is why we Christians celebrate the Resurrection and the Life of the Lord Jesus Christ.

My dear saints - you don't celebrate a dead god but a LIVING GOD, who had died for our sins but rose up on the third day never to die again.

The resurrection of Jesus separates Christianity from all other religions. Many people have come and gone speaking some revelation from God, but only Jesus has conquered death! Today He is no longer on the cross, but risen overcoming sin, death and the grave.
